Board of Trustees Regular Meeting
July 20, 2015

Trustees Present: Sue Hanley, Jennifer Kelley, Roberta Havholm, Jesse Morgan, Duane Veley, Chuck Evanhoe, and Shelton Monger

Trustees Absent: Greg Herman and Maria Ford

Jennifer Kelley called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Police Report: Officer Williams was present from the Dayton Police Department and reported on the previous months crime statistics. He said there were 2 thefts from vehicles and 1 other theft. All other criminal activity went down. There were 10 total crimes.

He also discussed the July 25th Coffee with Cops. It is scheduled for this Saturday at 10am.

The Board asked Officer Williams to look at a property and he said he would go to look at it right after the meeting.

There were no representatives present from the Riverside Police Department.

Visitors: Debbie Kessler and Norman Fleig

Mr. Fleig was present to discuss various neighborhood concerns. He asked that stumps and dead trees be removed. He asked that the entrances be lit appropriately. He also discussed various areas that he felt needed attention.

Mr. Fleig and the Board discussed the trash collection and that the contract with Dayton is ending this year.

Mr. Fleig also discussed the need to replace some sidewalks. Chris will take note of areas that need to be replaced.

Northeast Priority Board: No report.

Minutes: Sue Hanley moved that the June 15, 2015 meeting minutes be accepted with corrections. Chuck Evanhoe seconded.

Vote 7-0

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer, reported that the General Fund balance is \$166,019.11. Replacement reserve balance is \$57,096.66. We received 20 full and 7 partial assessments (\$4,867.00) in June, and we've received 3 full and 2 partial so far this month (\$735.00); so there are 52 full and 2 partial assessments still open (\$11,771.00). This compares to 70 assessments (\$14,033.00) still open at the same time in 2014.

Chuck Evanhoe moved to accept the Treasurer's report. Roberta Havholm seconded.

Vote 7-0

Murmurs: Roberta Havholm reported on the August issue. The theme will be Summer. The pertinent articles will include Graduation, Pool Rules, Soccer Schedule, and Raft Party. It will be delivered the first weekend of August. It will be printed on pink paper. The article deadline is July 24, 2015.

Communications Committee Report: Jennifer Kelley reported that she delivered three welcome packets and has one welcome packet to deliver.

Website: No report.

Pool: Ellie Monger, the pool manager, reported that they have had two sessions of swim lessons. She said they have had many parties with a few remaining this season. She said that candy sales have been doing really well. The swim team performed really well throughout the season and championships are this Saturday.

Pool and Outdoor Recreation Committee: Shelton Monger discussed the committee meeting where they discussed maintenance issues and the pool operations manual.

He discussed the significance of the task of tile replacement in the L-shaped pool. He also discussed issues with the baby pool. He is going to get quotes for the work, and they have not decided when to tackle the tasks at this point.

Jennifer Kelley asked Chris to look at an issue with the fence around the pool.

Green Areas: Chris Tooley discussed the current maintenance projects he's been working on:

Fixed clogged wood chipper, Fixed pin connecting tractor and batwing, Replaced belt on batwing, Welded wing arm on batwing, Fixed grasshopper driveshaft, Repaired radiator on grasshopper, Washed out sprayer,

He discussed other property projects completed, Finished mulching Boulevard, Mulched all playgrounds except Cottonwood, Mulched Willow branch trees/flower beds in Boulevard, Cut down tree on Boulevard, Started edging sidewalks, Grass seeded soccer goals, Spray roundup for weeds in mulch beds, Started trimming woods line at Silver Arrow, pool parking lot.

Upcoming projects: Next round fertilizer, Trim bushes at pool entrance, Woods line, Edge sidewalks, Finish mulching, Lawson fence.

Asset Management Committee: No report.

Old Business: Jennifer reported that there was no update with regards to the playground equipment.

Chuck Evanhoe presented the wording and layout for the Bob Gray memorial. He is going to get three quotes for the work. He also asked that we give opportunity for residents to donate.

Chuck Evanhoe made a motion to spend up to \$1,000 on the memorial as presented. Sue Hanley seconded.

Vote 7-0

Chris Tooley presented an opportunity for the board to purchase Halloween decorations for the party. Roberta made a motion to table the discussion. Sue Hanley seconded.

Vote 7-0

Jennifer Kelley discussed the volunteer picnic scheduled for August 9th.

The community garden fence permit application is submitted and the fence will be built when the permit is received.

New business: Jennifer Kelley said that Roberta's, Shelton's, and Greg's terms are due to expire and asked who would like to continue on the Board. Shelton said he would continue. Roberta said that she would probably not continue.

Jesse Morgan discussed adding a Frisbee golf course. He said that the Frisbee Golf Association could handle all costs associated adding with creating a cost. He asked if the board would be interested in hearing a formal presentation from a representative. The board agreed that it would be good to learn more and listen to a presentation.

Adjournment: Shelton Monger moved the meeting be adjourned and Chuck Evanhoe seconded.

The meeting ended at 9:07.

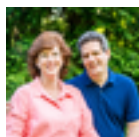

The By-laws for the Forest Ridge Association do not authorize us to require home owners to mow or weed their lawns.

From The OHIO BMV Motor Scooter Information

REMINDER OF OHIO'S MOTOR SCOOTER LAWS

Motor scooters and mini-motorcycles have become hot items among children and teenagers.

Parents, grandparents and other family members are spending their hard earned money to purchase scooters and mini-motorcycles – just to find out that most cannot be operated on Ohio's roads and their children - or grandchildren cannot legally operate the vehicle.

In Ohio, the motor scooters and mini-motorcycles cannot be legally operated on Ohio's roadways unless - they are titled, registered, covered by the proper insurance and the operator is at least 16 years old with a motorcycle license or endorsement on his or her driver license.

Most of the small electric and gas powered motor scooters, which are sold in sporting good stores and department stores, are not roadworthy, therefore cannot be titled or registered.

In order for the scooter or the mini-motorcycle to be considered roadworthy each must contain a seat, not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, contain the proper brake lights, turn signals, horn, rearview mirrors and headlights.

The county title office will then issue a title for your motor scooter or mini-motorcycle. The title will cost \$5.

After you purchase your title, you will need to register your vehicle. The annual registration costs \$28.50, plus a permissive tax if required and any new plate fees.

The motor scooter and mini-motorcycle will be issued a motorcycle plate, which will need to be attached to the vehicle.

Please make sure you have the proper insurance coverage on your motor scooter or mini-motorcycle, before registering your vehicle. The owner and the operator of the motor scooter or mini-motorcycle are subject to financial responsibility suspensions if the proper insurance is not maintained.

And finally, in order for the individual to legally operate the motor scooter or mini-motorcycle – he or she must be at least 16 years old and hold a valid driver license with a motorcycle endorsement or a motorcycle license. It is very important to know Ohio's road laws and signs before an individual attempts to operate a vehicle of any kind on Ohio's roadways. Licensed drivers have been tested on their knowledge and skills.

Please, know the law before you purchase a motor scooter or a mini-motorcycle. Know where they may be operated and who can operate them. If you have questions you may contact the BMV at 614-752-7800 and you also need to check with your local jurisdiction before you make the purchase.

It's about your safety, your children's safety and other drivers' safety.

When: 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesdays and Saturdays

Items Accepted: Paint, oil and gasoline (antifreeze, transmission fluid, stains, pesticides, fluorescent light bulbs, household batteries.

Free yard Waste: Grass clippings, brush and other organic materials free for Montgomery County residents (fee for sod or dirt)

Free recyclables: Bottles, jars, cans, mixed paper, cardboard boxes.

Non-recyclables: The fee for disposing of plastic bags, buckets ceramic, Styrofoam, plastic dell trays, window glass is \$38.25 per ton (average 2 cents per pound).

Tires: County residents can drop off 10 regular tires per year (driver's license required)

Old prescriptions: *Can be dropped off from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at 555 infirmery Road, Jefferson Township.*

What Benefits Will The City of Dayton Waste Collection Service Provide?

- 1. Enhanced Service Level** – Weekly waste and recycle collection will be provided. In addition free bi-weekly “Bulk Waste” collection will now be available on a pre-scheduled basis (please see more information later in this brochure). Plus, City of Dayton waste collection service **operates every business day and every holiday except Christmas Day.**
- 2. Uniformity** – All Riverside residents will be on the same system, which makes trash collection easier and improves the appearance of your neighborhood.

How Will the New Waste Collection Program Work?



Weekly waste collection, recycling and bi-weekly pre-schedule bulk waste services will be provided to homes between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday thru Friday.

Your Waste Collection Day Is...

Friday

Guidelines for Setting Out Your Container on Collection Day

- 1.** Keep your containers or trash bags away from parked cars and other obstacles.
- 2.** Put your waste containers or trash bags and recycler bins out by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.
- 3.** Do not put loose trash in your waste containers or boxes. Please wrap or bag all trash first then place in your waste containers or boxes.
- 4.** Do not overfill your waste container, trash bags or recycling bins; this will help keep your neighborhood clean.
- 5.** Yard waste (brush, hedges, tree limbs, etc.) must be tied into bundles not larger than 4 feet long and 18 inches in diameter. Bundles are limited to 25 pounds each.
- 6.** Recyclable means glass, aluminum, tin, plastic (#1 through #7), newspaper, magazine, cardboard, or other material determined by the City.



How Do I Schedule a “Bulk” Waste Pick-Up?

- 1.** Bulk waste pick-ups **must be scheduled in advance** by calling (937) 333-4800. Please call between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- 2.** Bulk waste items should be set out by 7:00 a.m. on the pre-scheduled collection day.
- 3.** One pick-up equals material totaling 4ft x 8ft x 4ft. in size. Please have your bulk waste ready for pick up on the scheduled date.
- 4.** You must separate your metal items (stoves, refrigerators, etc.) from other bulk items. Remember to remove refrigerator doors.
- 5.** All loose and small items must be securely contained, bundled or bagged for easy pick-up.
- 6.** Sorry, crews cannot pick up concrete, rocks, brick blocks, sand, gravel, demolition materials, or hazardous waste.

*Garbage and recycling are **not** collected on holidays.*

On weeks containing a holiday, waste collection service will be moved back one day following the holiday. For example, if your waste collection day is typically on Monday, but that day is a holiday, your garbage will be collected on Tuesday; Tuesday's normal collection will then move to Wednesday, and so on, through Friday. Holidays include New Year's Day; Martin Luther King Day; Good Friday; Memorial Day; Independence Day; Labor Day; Thanksgiving Day; Christmas Day.

Check to make sure everyone is in a proper child appropriate seat so that all are safely secured.

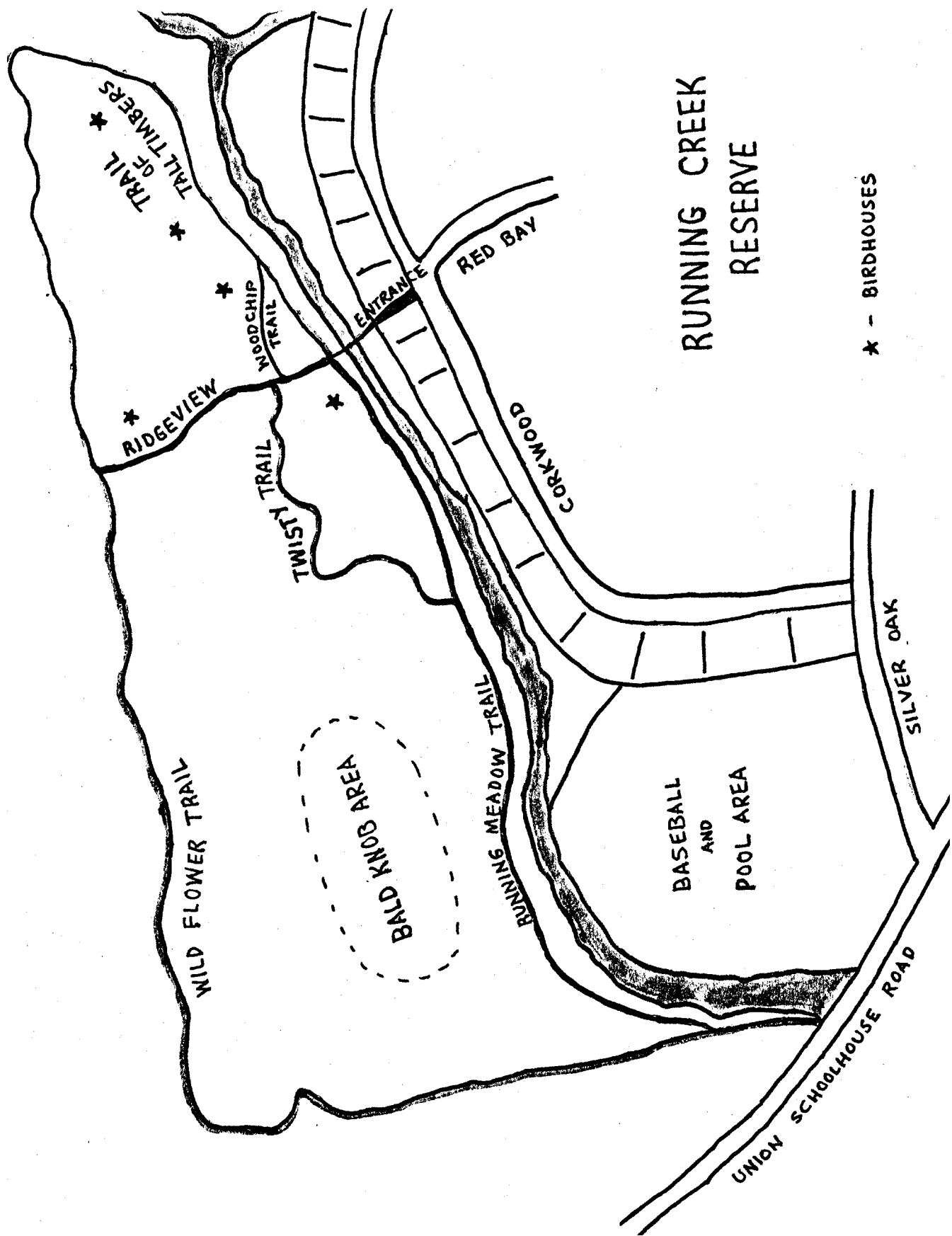
Don't pick up the phone; no matter how tempting.

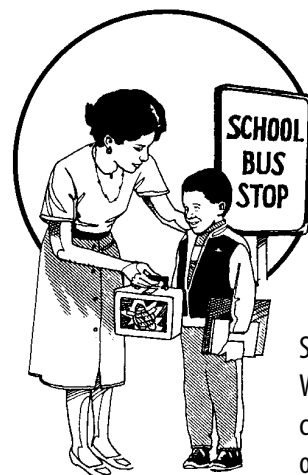
