# Forest Ridge Association Board of Trustees Regular Meeting August 19, 2013

**Trustees Present:** Bob Gray, Sue Hanley, Roberta Havholm, Shelton Monger, and Beverly Pendergast, Greg Herman, Maria Ford and Jake Bontatibus

Trustees Absent: Chuck Evanhoe

Bob Gray called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

**Police Report:** Riverside Police Department Sgt. Colon was present and discussed activity in the area for the past month as well as the upcoming Halloween parade.

Dayton Police Department Officers Brienza, Cartee, Dilley, and Wolpert was present and reported on criminal activity in their assigned area. There was 1 arson, 4 breaking and entering, 3 residential burglaries, 3 shoplifting, and 3 thefts from motor vehicles. There were also 6 calls for vandalism.

**Visitors:** Craig lannacchione was present to discuss his Eagle Scout bridge project.

Northeast Priority Board: Nothing to report.

**Minutes:** Roberta Havholm moved that the July 15, 2013 meeting minutes be accepted with corrections. Maria Ford seconded.

**Treasurer:** Dan Freeman, Treasurer, gave his report. The General Fund balance is \$114,298.65. Replacement reserve balance is \$67,745.72. We received 1 full and 3 partial assessments (\$219.00) in July, and we've received 2 partials (\$75.00) so far this month; so there are 63 full and 4 partial assessments still open (\$14,107.00). This compares to 70 assessments (\$15,050.00) still open at the same time in 2012.

Sue Hanley moved that the report be accepted. Beverly Pendergast seconded.

#### Vote 8-0

**Murmurs:** Roberta Havholm submitted her report that indicated the September issue would contain articles about The Curious Naturalist, Semi-annual Meeting, Free ESL Classes, Halloween Parade, and Major Johns' Remarks. Deadline for article submission is August 30, 2013. It will be delivered the second weekend of September.

**Communications Committee Report**: Bob Gray reported that nine packets were delivered last month and has several more to deliver.

**Website**: Greg Herman has been assisting with the updates to the website.

**Pool:** Ellie Monger, pool manager, was present and said that the family raft night went well. She also discussed the success

of the pool parties. Wednesday adult swims have not been well attended, probably due to weather. Next week, the pool will begin opening from 4pm to 8pm. She also mentioned the upcoming doggie swim, scheduled for September 3 from 6pm to 8pm.

**Pool and Outdoor Recreation Committee:** Shelton Monger discussed the completion of the swim team season.

Craig lannacchione discussed the progress of the soccer bridge project. Greg Herman mentioned that Cub Scout Pack 203 disbanded and donated all remaining funds to the bridge project.

Jesse Morgan was present to discuss the soccer program. He mentioned that the season goes from August 20 through October 19.

**Green Areas:** Mitch Bird, the Green Area Supervisor, was present and submitted the Green Area report. Current Projects include: Mowing and trimming weekly, Clean out gutters on both buildings, Replaced tank for well (in house repair), Trimmed all trees on the Boulevard (about 75 total), Clean up trees from storm, Spray beds for weeds, Trim woods line around some drains near sidewalks, Replaced belts on Lesco mower, Preventive Maintenance service on DX45, grasshopper; oil, oil, fuel and air filters and blades, Sharpened blades on large mower, rebalanced done every 3 weeks, Removed knifes on chipper, replaced with sharpened one, Preventive Maintenance service, Serviced all chain saws sharpen chains, and filters cleaned.

To Do: Three more trees from storm, Mulch around the Gazebo and four beds, Mow Hiking trails, Edge walks and curbs, Fill cracks in tennis courts, Fix Case DX45, speed control and engine over heats and loses a lot of speed, Grasshopper starting problem.

**Asset Management Committee**: Bob Gray said that they have taken pictures and recorded serial numbers of valuable assets.

**Old Business**: Bob Gray said the new Halloween parade coordinator is Lacey Soriero.

The volunteer picnic went well, and all attendees had a good time.

The general membership meeting is scheduled for September 9<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm at the Forest Ridge Baptist Church.

**New Business:** Bob Gray was getting more information on cost from ADT to secure the green area sheds.

The budget meeting is scheduled for October 21 at 6:00pm

**Adjournment**: Roberta Havholm moved the meeting be adjourned and Greg Herman seconded.





During the fall months, landscaping needs such as trimming hedges, harvesting gardens, raking leaves, and mowing the lawn often lead to a large quantity of yard waste. Proper disposal of yard waste helps protect the health and safety of our natural resources.

#### Stormwater Protection

Avoid raking leaves or blowing grass clippings onto the curb or the street. Yard waste that is left in streets can clog storm drains during rainstorms, causing flooding and soil erosion.

Rainstorms can also wash yard waste into our storm sewers. While wastewater from household sewers is treated to remove contaminants and organic material, storm sewers receive almost no treatment. Anything that gets washed down storm sewers ends up in our lakes and streams.

Yard waste that gets washed down the storm drain can lead to excess nutrient buildup in our streams, lakes, and other waterways. Excess nutrients can encourage algae growth and deplete the oxygen in water, which may kill fish, create strong odors and toxins, and destroy recreational areas.



These problems degrade the water quality of our lakes, streams, and other waterways, and harm our local outdoor recreational areas.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

#### Proper Yard Waste Disposal

We don't always think about where waste goes when we are done with it, but yard waste must be disposed of properly to protect our community and our environment. Please take the time to dispose of yard waste in a responsible manner.

If your neighborhood provides yard waste collection, you can leave yard waste on the curbside.

Montgomery County residents may take yard waste to the Solid Waste Transfer Station, located at 1001 Encrete Lane in Moraine, Ohio. Dropoff hours are 6 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday-Friday, or 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday. Some fees apply.

The Wagner Ford Landfill, located at 2670 Wagner Ford Road, Dayton, Ohio, also accepts yard waste at no charge, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday Friday, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays. There is no charge for this drop-off service.

#### Compost to Reduce Your Waste

Composting is a great alternative to disposing of yard waste, and provides an inexpensive mulch for flower beds and gardens. You can mix leaves with grass clippings, and allow the mixture to decompose into a rich, natural fertilizer for your landscaping needs. Compost bins are inexpensive, and they can be purchased at most gardening or hardware stores.


