Board of Trustees Regular Meeting
July 15, 2013

Trustees Present: Bob Gray, Sue Hanley, Roberta Havholm, Shelton Monger, and Beverly Pendergast, Greg Herman and Chuck Evanhoe

Trustees Absent:

Bob Gray called the meeting to order at 7:34 p.m.

Police Report: Riverside Police Department Officer Stamper was present and had nothing to report. A visitor asked a question about a resident carrying a weapon. Sue Hanley mentioned the use of motorized vehicles in the green areas. Another visitor discussed some vandalism in the area including a stop sign. Officer Stamper will follow up on the issues discussed.

Visitors: None

Northeast Priority Board: No report.

Minutes: Chuck Evanhoe moved that the June 17, 2013 meeting minutes be accepted with corrections submitted via email by July 18, 2013. Sue Hanley seconded.

Vote 7-0

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer, gave his report. The General Fund balance is \$153,951.60. Replacement reserve balance is \$67,741.61. We received 11 full and 3 partial assessments (\$2,534.00) in May, and we've received 1 partial (\$50.00) so far this month; so there are 64 full and 5 partial assessments still open (\$14,380.00). This compares to 75 assessments (\$16,125.00) still open at the same time in 2012.

Shelton Monger moved that the report be accepted. Roberta Havholm seconded.

Vote 7-0

Murmurs: Roberta Havholm submitted her report that indicated the August issue would contain articles about the Pool Rules, The Curious Naturalist, Semi-annual Meeting, and many other articles. Deadline for article submission is July 26, 2013. It will be delivered the first weekend of August.

Communications Committee Report: Bob Gray reported that several packets were delivered last month and has four more to deliver.

Website: Candi Morris has been assisting with the updates to the website.

Pool: Ellie Monger, pool manager, was present and said that things have been going well. She discussed the need to use more chlorine when the weather is very hot. She also discussed an issue with the baby pool.

Pool and Outdoor Recreation Committee: Jesse Morgan discussed the upcoming fall soccer season.

Green Areas: Mitch Bird, the Green Area Supervisor, was present and submitted the Green Area report:

Current Projects: Mowing and trim work, Mulching beds, trim and fertilize shrubs in beds, Tree trimming and removal of Ash trees with Emerald Ash Borer, four of them at Willow Branch, Cleanup work on about 20 trees from storm, 4-6 to go, Trimmed all trees along sidewalk at Willow Branch about 15 trees, Trimmed Viburnum around lift station in pool parking lot.

To Do: Fix DX45 mower speed control, and engine over heats in taller thick grass, 2005 Grasshopper starting problem every time now, 1995 John Deere 3785 hours no safety switches, no Rollover Protection System, will use about 20 ounces of oil a day mowing-replace this unit, Finish mulching and trimming beds about one half complete, Finish tree work 4-5 more trees that we know of need cleaned up, Hiking trails at Running Creek Reserve need trimmed and mowed, Water at shed from well is broken, non-potable water for spraying, Fill cracks in tennis courts some are very bad, Remove 13 Ash trees with Emerald Ash Borer at Wheeler, 3 on woods line will be removed, Remove dead Ash tree over the swing set at the boulevard playground.

Issues: Personal Protection Equipment for operators of chain saws, and for work done near roads, When and where the HOA cleans up trees, Employee issues.

Large concrete debris that was used to fill in broken walls in drains was washed away from heavy rains, DP&L line clearance in Silver Arrow left a large amount of brush from outage.

Asset Management Committee: Bob Gray reported that the committee will be meeting with Mr. Bird in the near future. Mr. Gray discussed some of the necessary security updates.

Old Business: Paypal donation has been placed on the website for the soccer bridge donations.

Maria Ford and Jake Bontatibus have volunteered to be on the board of Trustees. Maria has been appointed to serve a term that ends in September 2013. Jake's term will end in September 2014.

Bob Gray discussed the upcoming Halloween parade and the volunteer picnic.

New Business: The general membership meeting is scheduled for September 9th at 7:30 pm at the Forest Ridge Baptist Church.

Adjournment: Roberta Havholm moved the meeting be adjourned and Greg Herman seconded.

Huber Heights English Language Program

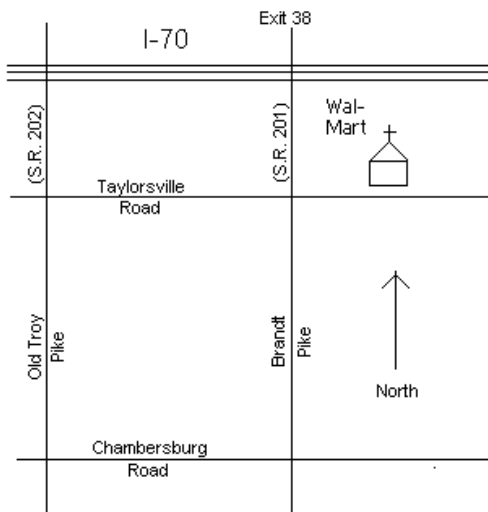

Ty and Susan,

Thank you for the Facebook posts. Let me start off by saying that I would love to have an EPOD Facebook page/account but there is a city policy strictly forbidding it and I have four sons to raise. I also want to point out that first and foremost I am a life-long resident of the City of Dayton and a 18 year resident of Willow Glen subdivision. When I read posts about people stating that the police don't care or that they are going to take matters into their own hands they need to look at the facts. Just several weeks ago I assigned a special unit of officers strictly to the Forest Ridge/Quail Hollow area (again) on the midnight shift. I do this frequently but don't publicize it. While they didn't find any thieves, they did find unlocked cars, valuables in plain sight and several home garage doors completely open. We try to be as proactive as possible and address issues immediately when they happen. Who solved the case last winter with the thief on the bike? The police. Who solved the recent thefts? A citizen who did the right thing and the police.

Having a safe community is not the sole responsibility of the police.....it's everyone's responsibility. Everything is not the police's fault. My mother was shot in the chest in 1988 at our house in Dayton. It wasn't the police's fault it was the criminal's fault. I too have been the victim of a burglary where every gun I owned, to include the one handmade by my father was stolen and never recovered. Was I pissed off? I sure was, but it wasn't the police's fault it was the criminal's fault.

EPOD has the largest geographical area of any precinct in the City of Dayton and it is being expanded in the next month or so. At any given time we may have 15- 20 cops working the entire area. We can't be everywhere all the time. We do care and we try to do the best that we can. I realize that for some that just isn't good enough and that's ok too. But don't complain that the police don't care or don't do anything when most residents don't do anything either to help out. Do they take an active role in their community by going to neighborhood meetings, getting involved in neighborhood watch, or send out important messages like you and Susan do? Probably not. We have offered to extend the Operation Identification up in that area but never heard much back. Let's see how many show up in court at sentencing and make a victim impact statement and request jail time from the judge. I sure hope they prove me wrong.

The majority of people who live in our neighborhood are great folks who do care and are appreciative. It just drives me crazy when some people are so quick to publicly complain and trash the police, but when they do something good they have nothing positive to say at all.

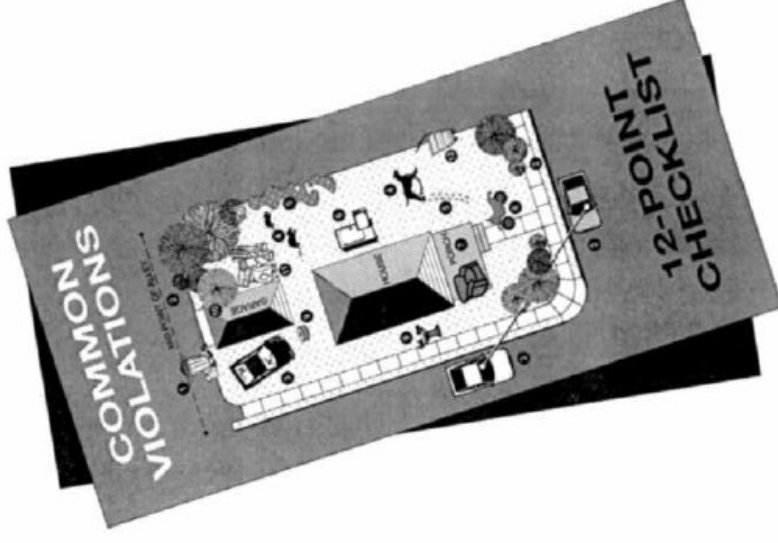

12-POINT CHECKLIST

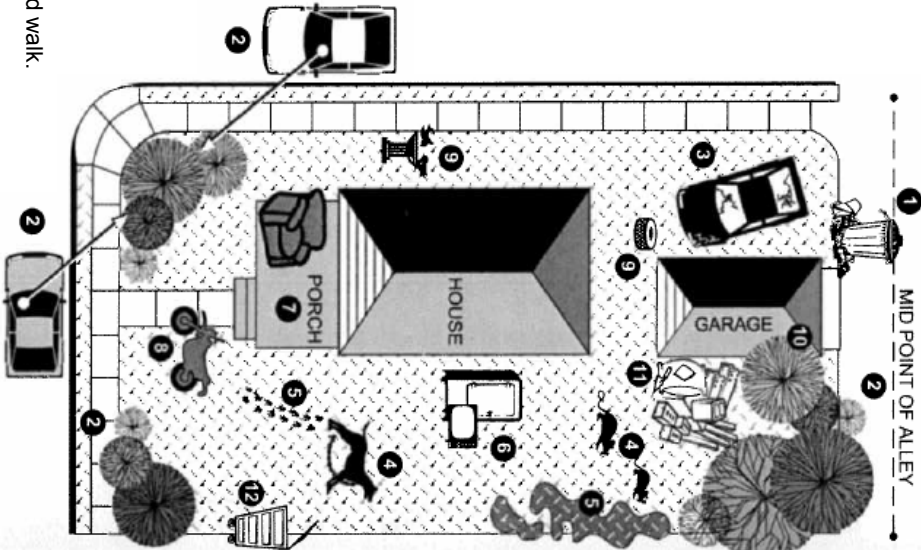
- Check your yard conditions by using the 12-point checklist shown on the right. If you find any violations please take action to make corrections as quickly as possible.
- If your yard passes the 12-point checklist — thank you for doing your part in maintaining the City's health, welfare and safety standards for neighborhoods.

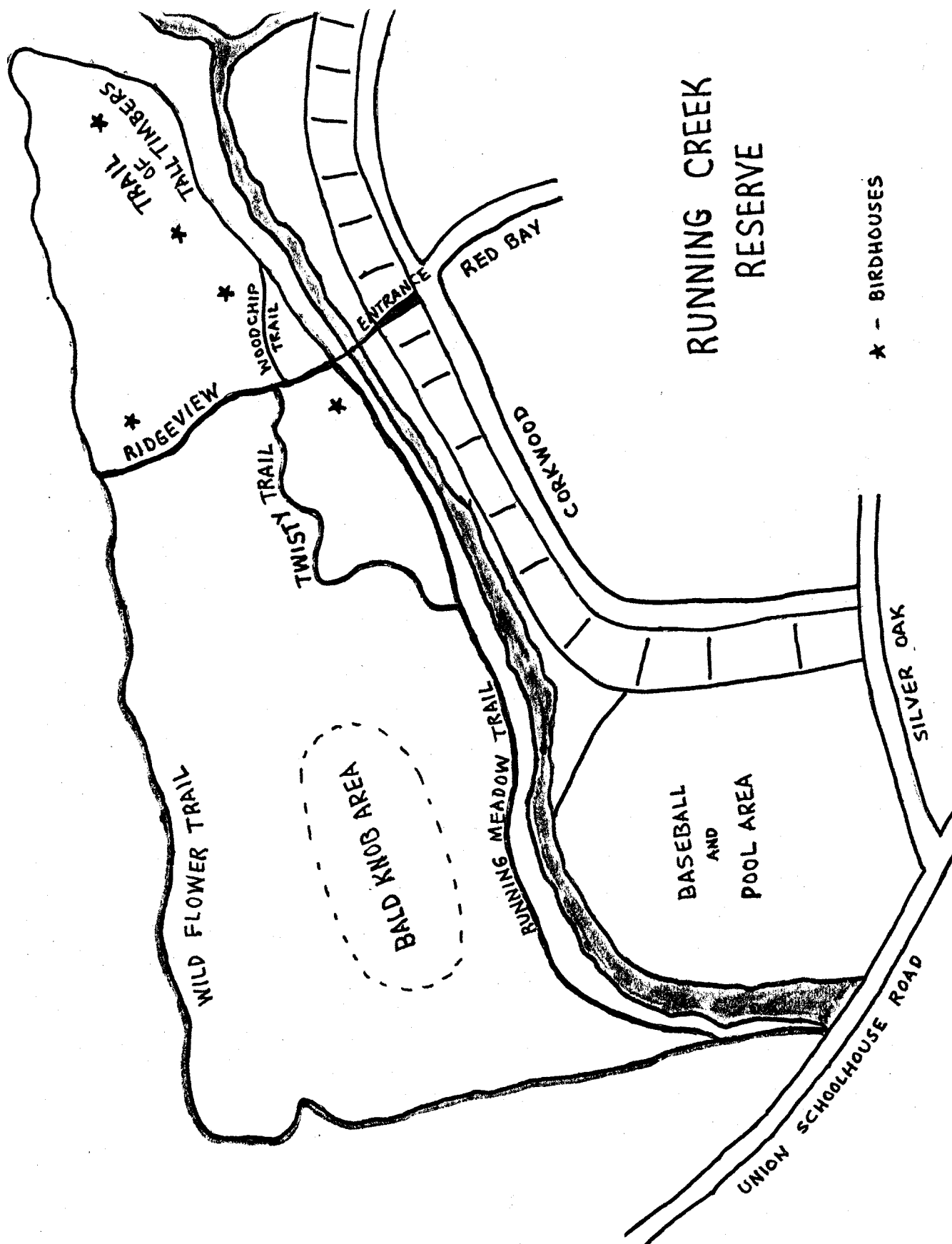

- 1 ☐ Trash, debris and broken glass not picked up on the premises (including to the midpoint of the alley). Waste for the City removal placed for pick up earlier than one day before scheduled pick up date.
- 2 ☐ Bushes, hedges, vines, weeds and/or trees growing into right of way or obstructing view of traffic.
- 3 ☐ Inoperative/junked and (or) unlicensed vehicle stored outside or vehicle parked on the lawn. No auto parts or outdoor storage of other inappropriate materials.
- 4 ☐ Rodents in the yard — call Rodent Control Services at 333-3977 for free outdoor baiting. Dog/animal feces not picked up daily. Pet food left out provides food for rodents.
- 5 ☐ Overgrown grass — not neatly cut and trimmed (mulch or compost after cutting). City will not remove grass. Ground cover required throughout yard and dog run area.
- 6 ☐ Bulk items (stoves, refrigerators, TV's, furniture and other items for special pick up) are not to be placed for pick up earlier than the day before scheduled pick date. Schedule pick up date by calling 333-4800.
- 7 ☐ Over stuffed/indoor furniture stored or used outdoors.
- 8 ☐ Motor vehicle (including motorcycles) parked on lawn or yard walk.
- 9 ☐ Containers holding stagnant water provide mosquito breeding habitat. Remove or treat with larvacide.
- 10 ☐ Trim trees away from house and garage. Remove/trim dead limbs from tree. Remove dead trees from yard.
- 11 ☐ Commercial and business equipment stored on residential property, no trucks rated over one ton.
- 12 ☐ Waste container stored where offensive to occupants of adjacent properties, and/or offensive waste in container.

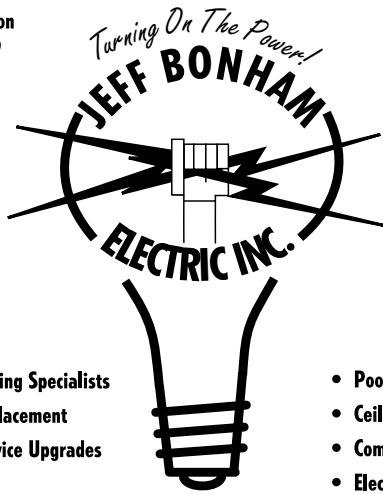
