

Forest Ridge Association Board of Trustees Regular Meeting February 20, 2017

Trustees Present: Chris Hummer, Elizabeth Burke, Jake Bontatibus, Lacey Soriero, Sue Hanley, Mike Milisits, Carol Wallace, and Shelton Monger

Trustees Absent: Greg Herman

Chris Hummer called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Police Report: Officer Toscani, from the City of Riverside, presented crime statistics for the past month. He noted the one heroin overdose as outside of the norm. He also said telephone fraud complaints are on the rise. Finally, he discussed the possibility of a community event to meet the police. Officer Toscani is going to work with Jake Bontatibus and the activities committee to help plan the event.

Officer Rudy from the City of Dayton presented the crime statistics for the past month. He said the activity was made up of: 3 shoplifting, 1 theft, 1 fraud, 1 drug paraphernalia, 1 larceny, and 1 other offense. A resident discussed an issue with a stop sign on Amberwood and having people run the stop sign at high speeds.

Minutes: Shelton Monger moved to accept the minutes as corrected. Elizabeth Burke seconded.

Open Forum for Association Members: Rick Schaub was present to ask questions about where funds were being spent and what efforts were being made to improve the recreation.

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer reported that the General Fund balance is \$68,237.79. Replacement reserve balance is \$67,815.95. We received 316 full and 8 partial assessments in January (\$72,336.00), and we've received 222 full and 3 partial assessments so far this month (\$50,594.00); so there are 583 full and 3 partial assessments still open (\$132,620.00). This compares to 589 assessments (\$131,686.00) still open at the same time in 2016.

Chris Hummer made a motion to approve the treasurer's reports from January 2017 and February 2017. Lacey Soriero seconded the motion.

Assets and Maintenance: Chris Hummer discussed the state of getting quotes for the shed repair including the restroom. Jake Bontatibus is going to get new quotes. Chris also discussed the reserve study and the need to look at the condition of the associations' assets.

Bylaws: Shelton Monger discussed the status of the activities of the bylaws committee. He said they have made many changes so that the bylaws will work better for the modern organization. The current changes are out to the committee for review. Any updated changes will be incorporated and presented to the board. Once the board approves changes, he will work with the attorney. After the attorney approves, the bylaws will be available to the community and the board will work to get people at the semi-annual meeting in the fall for community approval.

Activities: Jake Bontatibus and Lacey Soriero discussed the upcoming planning meeting and some of the ideas they are working on.

Greens Areas: Mike Milisits reported that he is going to get new quotes for tree removal. He is also working on the trail maps for the area. He also discussed the possibility of removing lights, and he is working on a map.

Chris Tooley, Green Area Manager, submitted the following report:

Projects this month:

- Picked up trash
- Picked up storm/wind debris
- Cut down 6 trees at Bid Good Area

Chris Hummer asked about reducing some of the mowing area to save money, but others on the board said it has been tried in the past with issues.

Pool and Outdoor Recreation: Ellie Monger, Pool Area Manager, said she has started contacting guards from previous years. She has a good idea of who is coming back now. She said she has four open positions. She is also going to start working on clean-up due to the nice weather.

Ellie also discussed the last efforts that are going on to get swim team volunteers. The Green Areas team is going to be mowing the pool area.

Chris Hummer asked Shelton about the epoxy of the tile in the pool. He is waiting on a response from one vendor.

Social Media and Publicity: Greg Herman was not present, but submitted the Facebook 1,124 Likes and 807 neighbors on Nextdoor.com.

Old Business: No old business.

New Business: Jake Bontatibus discussed the possibility of allowing renters to pay "current year" dues in order to use the pool when owners are in arrears. The group tabled the discussion for a later date to gather additional information.

Chris Hummer presented 3 quotes for the reserve study. He said one was too high, but the other two were within a few hundred dollars of each other. He said the studies would provide a qualitative assessment of all the facilities and when they would need to be replaced along with a financial plan for replacement. Jake Bontatibus made a motion to employ Miller Dodson for \$3,670. Carol Wallace seconded.

Vote 8-0

Adjournment- Mike Millisets moved to adjourn the meeting. Lacey Soriero seconded.

* This fee does not include membership to the FRA pool or use of the pool other than for swim team practice, meets and special events.

Children ages 5-18 (as of June 1, 2017), who can swim the length of the lap pool, are eligible to join the team. If you aren't sure your swimmer can swim the length of the pool they can come to the first week of practice on a trial basis.

- o The swim team is associated with the *Miami Valley Swim Association*-www.mvsaswim.org.
- o The team travels to 4 pools each summer.
- o Swimmers participate throughout the season in pool parties, fundraisers and special events like our ice cream social.
- o Fundraisers include a concessions stand at every home meet, the July 4th pool party and the End-of-Summer pool party. *The Swim-a-thon* is our major fundraising event.

Adult help is essential. Parents or caregivers are required to volunteer to fill the manpower needs of all home meets, away meets and to participate in the fundraisers. Everyone can be trained for every job at a swim meet.

We will have an open house on **May 20**th so you can talk with coaches and members of the swim team committee. You will also be able to try on and order the **team suit**. Payment is due at the time of your order.

In accordance with the Code of Regulations of the Forest Ridge Association, Article VIII (see above)

Green Space/Recreation Area policy:

The green areas and recreation facilities are for the common use and enjoyment of the residents of Forest Ridge and their guests. The Board of Trustees is responsible for the management and maintenance of these common areas.

Any projects affecting these areas or facilities must be approved by the Board of Trustees before any such projects are undertaken. Failure to do so could possibly result in criminal charges, depending on the gravity of the situation.

All people involved (including Trustees) in any communal area projects will be required to sign a liability waiver. Any person or group not obtaining approval shall be subject to penalties, which may include: Repair of any damage to grounds/gardens or payment for the repair thereof, suspension of privileges, or possible legal action.

Call for Lifeguard Applications 2017 Season

The Forest Ridge Association is accepting applications for lifeguards and Recreation Supervisors for the 2017 season. Those interested must have current Lifeguard training, Standard First Aid, and CPR for the Professional Rescuer. Those with old Lifeguard Training will be required to update when the pool opens. WSI certification is recommended for consideration but not required for the available positions. Applications should be in résumé form and must include copies of the front and back of all certifications. The résumé should include any experience with young children, school, and community activities. Also include 2 written references from former employers, teachers, or community leaders. Previous employees of FRA do not need to submit references. The staff is responsible for helping with the opening of the pool and must be available to work on weekends during May (possible exceptions if away at school). You must also include your swimsuit and shirt size, date you can start full-time, all dates you must have off, and when you return to school.

Each year of experience means one season consisting of at least eight full weeks. For example, if an individual was hired prior to June 30 and works through Labor Day, the individual will be paid the next step the next year. If the individual is hired after July 1, the individual will be paid the same step for the entire next year. Prior experience at another pool, regardless of the number of years, will qualify the individual for a Step 2 if it can be verified that the individual has at least one full year of experience.

Residents of Forest Ridge receive preference for these positions, assuming they are otherwise qualified. WSI qualified applicants are preferred.

¹ Lifeguard certifications must be current at all times. It is the responsibility of each employee to provide such certification to the Recreation Area Manager. The base rate will be effective from the date the manager receives the certification, not retroactive to the date of the certification. If the Manager does not have a current lifeguard certification on file, the employee will be paid \$3.95/hour until such certification is provided.

² Current WSI certificates must be provided to the Recreation Area Manager in order to receive this rate. Once the WSI certification expires, the individual will be paid at the base rate until a current WSI certificate is again provided to the Recreation Area Manager. The WSI rate is effective on the date the Recreation Area Manager receives the current certificate, not retroactive to the effective date of the certificate.


