Trustees Present: Shelton Monger, Greg Herman, Jake Bontatibus, Elizabeth Burke, Chris Hummer, Mike Milisits, Sue Hanley, Carol Wallace and Lacey Soriero

Trustees Absent: None

Chris Hummer called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Police Report: Officer Toscani reported on the monthly crime statistics for the area. He said there was one car broken into that was unlocked. There were no other significant issues this month.

Officers Reeb and Conrads from the Dayton Police Department were present to report on 7 crimes last month. The crimes included a residential burglary. He said there is generally a spike in robberies during December, so they are going to be focusing more in the general Forest Ridge area. He encouraged people to keep their doors locked. He also said there is going to be a zero tolerance on stop sign and speeding offenses in the area. Additionally, he encouraged residents to coordinate issues with dispatch. When dispatch receives the same complaints multiple times from multiple residents, its priority is raised.

Visitors: Many visitors were present for the budget review.

Minutes: Carol Wallace moved that the meeting minutes be accepted as corrected, Shelton Monger seconded.

Open Forum for Association Members: Bill Dean voiced a concern about traveling in snow in the Ridge. He said he wrote an article for the Murmurs about traveling in the snow. He handed the article to Roberta Havholm and the board members.

Budget Review Chris Hummer went over all the areas of the budget and explained the reasoning used behind various increases. He said that anyone that would like a copy of the budget is welcome to it if they email him and ask for it.

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer, reported that the General Fund balance is \$23,664.14. Replacement reserve balance is \$77,809.48. We received no assessments in October, and we've received 2 full assessments so far this month (\$448.00); so there are 37 full and 4 partial assessments still open (\$8,548.00). This compares to 40 assessments (\$8,835.00) still open at the same time in 2015.

Sue Hanley moved to make the 2017 assessment rate \$227. Chris Hummer seconded.

Vote 9-0

Chris Hummer moved that the November 21, 2016 Treasurer's report be accepted as submitted. Jake Bontatibus seconded.

Vote 9-0

Assets and Maintenance: Jake Bontatibus discussed the efforts about adding a bathroom in the maintenance shed. He said there is more research to be done. He has also received quotes on the shed replacement, but is waiting to find out final details on a bathroom before proposing anything with the replacement. Chris Hummer said the electrical fix at the gazebo was completed before the Halloween party. Chris Hummer said he is going to bring reserve study quotes to discuss during the December meeting.

Bylaws: Shelton Monger said that the committee has had two meetings and has worked through about 2/3rds of the bylaws. He said they are working to create a set of proposed changes to vote on at the March semi-annual meeting.

Activities: Jake Bontatibus discussed the Halloween event. He said there was very good turnout and hopes that it will continue to increase in the coming years. He said they added hayrides this year, and it was very well received.

Elizabeth Burke discussed the Senior Resident Engagement. She said they are looking at Monday afternoon or Tuesday morning at the Huber Heights library. Eventually, she would like to involve the area teenagers.

Roberta Havholm said that she thought it was a great idea, but the board may want to consider background checks when involving the teenagers.

Green Areas: Mike Milisits discussed the ash trees that need to be removed. He said that he walked the area with a lumber buyer. He said there are several trees of value that need to be removed. He said they will continue to consider it, but it will cause a significant mess during the removal.

Mike suggested that the night lights outside of the pool area could be shut off. Shelton Monger said that during the Winter that could be ok, but vandalism during the summer might require continued lighting. The board agreed to have appropriate lights turned off and evaluate which ones should be turned back on after the winter.

Lacey Soriero discussed the playground grant that the Association received. She said they raised about \$1,100 of a \$2,400 match that needed to be applied before purchasing the equipment and receiving the grant.

Green Areas: Chris Tooley, Green Area Manager, submitted the following report:

Pool and Outdoor Recreation: Shelton Monger said that he has not done anything about tile repair yet. He said the water has been turned off, and they have ordered some chairs. He also said they still need swim team help for next year.

Social Media and Publicity:

Website: Greg Herman reported on the websites. He reported that 766 neighbors had signed up for NextDoor.com. The Forest Ridge Facebook page had 1122 likes.

Murmurs: Roberta Havholm discussed the upcoming December Murmurs. The theme will be Christmas. The pertinent articles will be the 2017 Assessment, Luminaria, and Delinquent Assessments. The deadline for articles is November 25th, 2016. The delivery date will be the first weekend in December.

Roberta discussed the issue with getting away from the paper Murmurs. She said she is going to keep the Murmurs at 12 pages next year, and anything extra will be put in the online version. She will keep the printing the same for 2017, but in 2018 will bid out to see if there can be any savings.

Old Business: No old business.

New Business: Sue Hanley made a motion to provide the remaining \$1,369.58 for the playground grant match. Carol Wallace seconded.

Vote 9-0

Jake Bontatibus discussed his idea for decorating the shed and having a Christmas party with Santa and Mrs. Claus. He asked for \$130 to pay for the Santa and Mrs. Claus for 2 hours.

Shelton Monger moved to provide \$130 for the Santa and Mrs. Claus for the event. Greg Herman seconded.

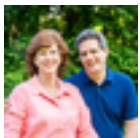

Green Space/Recreation Area Policy

Article VIII (Powers and duties of the Board of Trustees)

Section 1. Powers The Board of Trustees shall have power:

(a) To adopt and publish rules and regulations governing the use of the property of the Association, and the personal conduct of the members or their guests...and establish penalties for the infraction thereof.

Green Space/Recreation Area policy:

In accordance with the Code of Regulations of the Forest Ridge Association, Article VIII (see above)

The green areas and recreation facilities are for the common use and enjoyment of the residents of Forest Ridge and their guests. The Board of Trustees is responsible for the management and maintenance of these common areas.

Any projects affecting these areas or facilities must be approved by the Board of Trustees before any such projects are undertaken. Failure to do so could possibly result in criminal charges, depending on the gravity of the situation.

All people involved (including Trustees) in any communal area projects will be required to sign a liability waiver.

Any person or group not obtaining approval shall be subject to penalties, which may include: Repair of any damage to grounds/gardens or payment for the repair thereof, suspension of privileges, or possible legal action.

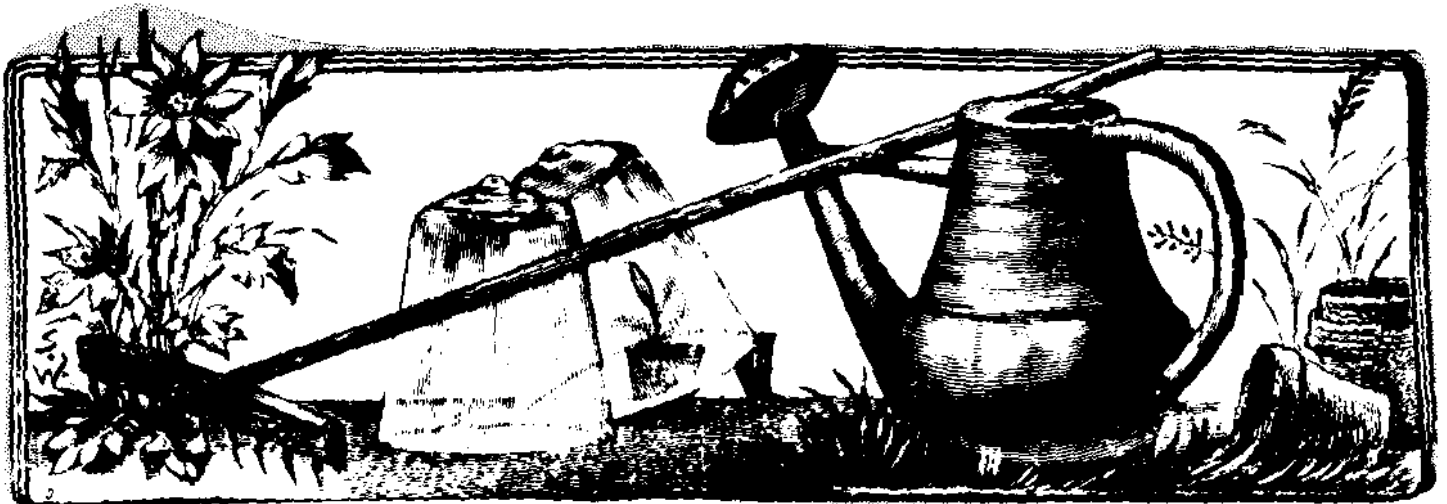

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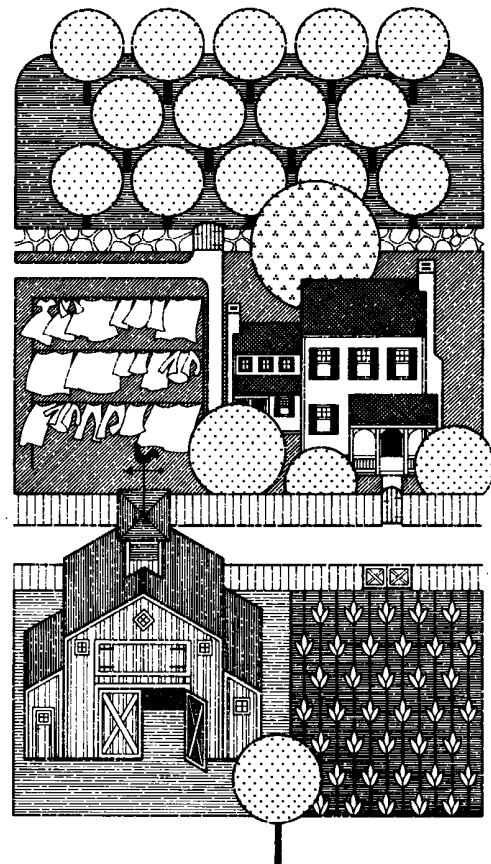
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Attention Renters:
