Trustees Present: Shelton Monger, Jake Bontatibus, Elizabeth Burke, Chris Hummer, Mike Milisits, Sue Hanley, and Carol Wallace

Trustees Absent: Greg Herman, and Lacey Soriero

Chris Hummer called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

Police Report: Officer Toscani from the City of Riverside reported on the monthly crime statistics for the month. He said there were a few unlocked car break-ins, but suspicious calls have gone down due to the cold weather. He said there was nothing out of the ordinary. He reminded residents to remove valuables from their vehicles, and to lock car doors.

Officer Reeb from the City of Dayton was present to report on monthly crime statistics. He also mentioned the officer that got struck by a vehicle. He asked for residents to remember him in prayer as he is going to need his leg amputated. There is a fund for Byron Branch to help support him set up at Key Bank. He also discussed some of the work they've been doing including some very large drug busts. He mentioned the support being provided by Ohio State Patrol including air support.

Volunteers: Jake Bontatibus announced his recognition and appreciation for volunteers Logan Fry, Rachel Buscher, Holliann Combs and Samantha Fox. They were presented with gift cards to show the Green Area maintenance team's appreciation for their hard work.

Minutes: Shelton Monger moved that the meeting minutes be accepted as corrected, Carol Wallace seconded.

Vote 7-0

Open Forum for Association Members: Ellie Monger relayed a suggestion to give residents the option to purchase luminaires to the monthly assessment. The board suggested keeping the assessment fee completely on its own. Chris suggested that the board look for a better way to get the luminaires out and receive payment.

Mike Fry thanked Jake Bontatibus and Holli Ann Combs.

Jake Bontatibus submitted this note to express gratitude.

"I would like to thank Holli Ann Combs for her tireless work helping one of our families who experienced a tragic disaster. This family lost everything in a house fire. Holli put together a clothes drive to replace an entire wardrobe, set up a collection fundraiser to help offset medical costs and rebuild this family's whole world with the bank, and a toy drive for a very young lady to have some kind of birthday and Christmas.

Additionally, I would like to thank Liz Hummer for her support putting together a food train for the family as they were constantly running back and forth between home, hospitals, investigations (standard stuff, nothing nefarious), insurance meetings, etc.

Thank you both of you and everybody else who responded and supported this family so quickly in their moment of greatest need. I wouldn't wish this on anybody, but it's good to know we live in a community where, in the event of an emergency, there is so much support."

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer, reported that the General Fund balance is \$9,921.54. Replacement reserve balance is \$77,811.13. We received 2 assessments in November (\$448.00), and we've received no assessments so far this month; so there are 37 full and 3 partial assessments still open (\$8,548.00). This compares to 40 assessments (\$8,835.00) still open at the same time in 2015.

Chris Hummer has been added to the Chase account as a signer.

Sue Hanley moved that the December 19, 2016 Treasurer's report be accepted as submitted. Jake Bontatibus seconded.

Chris Hummer said that he would like to create some line item descriptions for the budget for presentation in the Murmurs.

Chris Hummer said that he was going to work on an end of year report to discuss some of the details of the expenditures in 2016.

Assets and Maintenance: Chris Hummer said that they are going to continue to evaluate the shed replacement. Chris said that he is continuing to work on the reserve study quotes and is trying to get more information from the companies. Chris also reported on the progress of the playground. He said the semi-annual report is due on the 15th of January. The playground is going to be purchased in April.

Bylaws: Shelton Monger said that they haven't had any recent meetings, but they are going to work further in January. They are trying to have a draft by the end of January.

Activities: Jake Bontatibus discussed the Christmas party; he was very thankful to Mike Fry and Chris Tooley as well as Lacey Soriero for their work making the party a success. He thanked the neighborhood for all the donations to the family that lost their home in a fire. He also talked about the Christmas light contest.

Sue Hanley discussed the treats for first responders. She said they had around 30 residents that delivered items and she was thankful and impressed with the effort.

Green Areas: Mike Milisits discussed the work in the Green Areas and said the season is wrapped up. He said the areas look great.

The board discussed the community garden and some of the concerns. The board agreed to consider beautification of the garden area.

Chris Tooley, Green Area Manager, submitted the following report:

- Cut down a tree from storm damage
- Cut down a tree on property line to help a resident
- Put out snowplow deflectors along boulevard
- Hosted Christmas party

Chris Tooley said that cutting some of the problem trees will need to be a priority. Chris Tooley is going to give a prioritized list of trees to Mike Milisits to have a company potentially take down the trees that are in areas near residences.

Chris Hummer suggested that next year they should work on the trail reclamation and a trail map. Chris Tooley agreed that they could and should work on the trails. Mike Milisits said that he would begin the process of creating an updated trail map.

Pool and Outdoor Recreation: Ellie Monger reported that she purchased some new chairs. She also discussed replacing the diving board, and the need to address it in the Spring.

Jesse Morgan discussed the Fall soccer season and the upcoming Spring season. The Spring season will start in March. He also discussed the possibility of joining another league if there aren't enough sign-ups.

Shelton Monger said the swim team has not gotten any volunteers to replace those that are leaving the program. If there are no volunteers by March, then the program may need to dissolve. The board will decide the future of the program in the March meeting.

Social Media and Publicity:

Website: Greg Herman was not present, so website and media data was not available.

Murmurs: No January Murmurs.

Chris Hummer has delivered four welcome packets and has one to deliver. He suggested adding other volunteers to the welcoming committee.

Old Business: No old business.

New Business:

Chris Hummer presented the 2017 budget for approval by board. Sue Hanley moved to approve the budget as presented. Shelton Monger seconded.

Adjournment: Chris Hummer moved that the meeting be adjourned. Shelton Monger seconded.

Chris Hummer called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Police Report: Officer Toscani, from the City of Riverside, stated that traffic stops were stepped up with only one theft and one automobile break in. There was a call for some suspicious persons walking in a cul-de-sac, possibly looking for packages. Citizens were concerned that tickets were not being written for "California stops". Officer Toscani stated that it at the discretion of the officer pulling over the vehicle.

Minutes: Shelton Monger moved to accept the minutes to be accepted as amended once everyone has had the opportunity to review. The board agreed to approve the minutes at the next meeting.

Open Forum for Association Members: No residents in attendance

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer, was not present so Elizabeth Burke presented his report. The report stated that the General Fund balance is \$2,415.24. Replacement reserve balance is \$67,814.63. We received 1 assessment in December (\$224.00), and we've received 1 assessment so far in January (\$224.00); so there are 35 full and 3 partial assessments still open (\$8,100.00). This compares to 40 assessments (\$8,835.00) still open at the same time in 2015. The approval of the report was tabled until the next meeting.

Assets and Maintenance: Chris Hummer is preparing a summary of the reserve study quotes that he has been collecting. No update on the shed repair.

Bylaws: Shelton Monger has been modifying the document to send to the rest of the committee so they can continue to work through it. They are also planning on meeting again before the next general meeting. They are looking at other options (Panera) for a Sunday meeting.

Activities: Jake Bontatibus would like to get together in February to discuss new events (like Fitness) and go over the Easter event. Elizabeth Burke has the first senior citizen outreach game day scheduled for February 22 from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m..

Green Areas: Mike Milisits reported that if the lights by the pool were to be turned off we would have to sign a 2-year agreement to turn the lights back on. He discussed possibly removing (turning off) the lights towards

the back of the property. Mike would like to get paint marks on the trees that are priority for removal. Mike would like to make a green area map out of a wide tree trunk. Chris Hummer stated Bill Tocci is still working the Community Garden through the end of this season.

Chris Tooley, Green Area Manager, submitted the following report: Projects this month:

- Got tractor back from shop (just over \$2,000 for tune up and fluid replacement)
- Cleaned up Christmas party
- Cleaned up storm debris on Meadowsweet
- •Cleaned up Boulevard from trash and debris

To Do:

- Remove Christmas lights from sign and gazebo
- · Clean up storm damage on Sweetleaf

Pool and Outdoor Recreation: No update on tile repair. Shelton Monger is going to get in touch with the contractor who uses epoxy products. He is hoping they can start the demo work before the spring. Possibly looking at other avenues to repair/refinish the diving board (and the diving platforms/blocks), as opposed to replacing.

Ellie Monger, Pool Area Manager, will be emailing her guards to see who will be coming back for the upcoming season to see how many new guards she needs to hire. She will put one last plea in the Murmurs for some individuals to step up to run the swim team. The swim league schedule gets put together in April, hoping to have someone by February or March.

Playground- The president has submitted the packet to the city. The next step is ordering the equipment and getting it installed. We are looking at installation to happen in early May.

Social Media and Publicity: Greg is not present. Chris Hummer will get his report.

Thank you to Hollian Combs.

Old Business: No old business.

New Business: No new business.

Adjournment- Shelton Monger moved to adjourn the meeting. Jake Bontatibus seconded.

The green areas and recreation facilities are for the common use and enjoyment of the residents of Forest Ridge and their guests. The Board of Trustees is responsible for the management and maintenance of these common areas.

Any projects affecting these areas or facilities must be approved by the Board of Trustees before any such projects are undertaken. Failure to do so could possibly result in criminal charges, depending on the gravity of the situation.

All people involved (including Trustees) in any communal area projects will be required to sign a liability waiver. Any person or group not obtaining approval shall be subject to penalties, which may include: Repair of any damage to grounds/gardens or payment for the repair thereof, suspension of privileges, or possible legal action.

Call for Lifeguard Applications 2017 Season

The Forest Ridge Association is accepting applications for lifeguards and Recreation Supervisors for the 2017 season. Those interested must have current Lifeguard training, Standard First Aid, and CPR for the Professional Rescuer. Those with old Lifeguard Training will be required to update when the pool opens. WSI certification is recommended for consideration but not required for the available positions. Applications should be in résumé form and must include copies of the front and back of all certifications. The résumé should include any experience with young children, school, and community activities. Also include 2 written references from former employers, teachers, or community leaders. Previous employees of FRA do not need to submit references. The staff is responsible for helping with the opening of the pool and must be available to work on weekends during May (possible exceptions if away at school). You must also include your swimsuit and shirt size, date you can start full-time, all dates you must have off, and when you return to school.

Each year of experience means one season consisting of at least eight full weeks. For example, if an individual was hired prior to June 30 and works through Labor Day, the individual will be paid the next step the next year. If the individual is hired after July 1, the individual will be paid the same step for the entire next year. Prior experience at another pool, regardless of the number of years, will qualify the individual for a Step 2 if it can be verified that the individual has at least one full year of experience.

Residents of Forest Ridge receive preference for these positions, assuming they are otherwise qualified. WSI qualified applicants are preferred.

¹ Lifeguard certifications must be current at all times. It is the responsibility of each employee to provide such certification to the Recreation Area Manager. The base rate will be effective from the date the manager receives the certification, not retroactive to the date of the certification. If the Manager does not have a current lifeguard certification on file, the employee will be paid \$3.95/hour until such certification is provided.

² Current WSI certificates must be provided to the Recreation Area Manager in order to receive this rate. Once the WSI certification expires, the individual will be paid at the base rate until a current WSI certificate is again provided to the Recreation Area Manager. The WSI rate is effective on the date the Recreation Area Manager receives the current certificate, not retroactive to the effective date of the certificate.


