September 21, 2015

Trustees Present: Sue Hanley, Jennifer Kelley, Maria Ford, Shelton Monger, Greg Herman, Jesse Morgan, and Duane Veley

Trustees Absent: Chuck Evanhoe

Jennifer Kelley called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Police Report: Officer Colon was present from the Riverside Police Department. Sue Hanley asked if they were doing drug disposal this weekend for the national promotion. Officer Colon said that they are not. He discussed the activity over the past week.

No one was present from the Dayton Police Department.

Visitors: Jake Bontatibus was present to discuss the Halloween parade.

Election of Officers: Jennifer Kelley called for nominations for President. Sue Hanley nominated Jennifer Kelley and Maria Ford seconded the nomination.

Greg Herman moved to close nominations and elect the single nomination. Jesse Morgan seconded.

Jennifer Kelley called for nominations for Vice President. Jennifer Kelley nominated Sue Hanley and Maria Ford seconded the nomination.

Shelton Monger moved to close the nominations and elect the single nomination. Duane Veley seconded.

Minutes: Jennifer Kelley moved that the August 17, 2015 meeting minutes be accepted with corrections. Maria Ford seconded.

Vote 7-0

Treasurer: Sue Hanley asked that the list of households with 2015 unpaid assessments be posted in the Murmurs. The board concurred. Jennifer Kelley moved that the August 17, 2015 Treasurer's report be accepted and Duane Veley seconded.

Vote 7-0

Murmurs: Jennifer Kelley submitted the Murmurs report for the October issue on behalf of Roberta Havholm. The theme is the Halloween parade. The Murmurs will contain information regarding the election of trustees and soccer information for the fall season. The last day to submit an article will be August 21, 2015. It will be delivered a week early due to the semi-annual meeting.

Communications Committee Report: Jennifer Kelley reported that she has three welcome packets to deliver.

Website: Greg Herman reported we have 400 neighbors signed up for the Nextdoor app and we have 928 likes on the Forest Ridge Facebook page. Greg said that the Riverside police department applied to have an agency page on the Nextdoor website and should be set up soon.

Pool: Ellie Monger was present and reported that the pool closing is nearly done and she only has some cleaning remaining.

Pool and Outdoor Recreation Committee: Shelton Monger said that they are going to reinstall the chlorine delivery system. He is also said he is having some difficulty getting quotes for the tile work at the pool.

Jesse Morgan discussed the success of the Soccer program and

that the season is about halfway through. He also discussed some equipment purchases.

Green Areas: Chris Tooley, green area supervisor, submitted a report on the following green area activity in the previous month: Projects:

Grease equipment/sharpen blades, Ordered parts for chain saw, and Ordered parts for mower.

Property: Cut down 3 trees at pool, Trimmed trees at little park, Woods line at gazebo, Pool/soccer field, tree farm, Mulched Sweetleaf, and Fixed lights and ballast at sign.

To Do: Address sidewalk regarding Time Warner cable damage, Gate hinges at pool, Woods line, Sidewalks, Prep for Halloween, Cut down magnolias by pool, and Rent stump grinder.

Purchase: Miscellaneous parts for equipment

Recommendations: Buy aerator for turf

Chris discussed the condition of some sidewalks and asked about repairing. The board suggested that he tally the number of sidewalks that need repair and report at the next meeting.

Chris asked about stump grinding and the board said there was money available in the tree budget to rent the stump grinder. The board suggested he start in the playgrounds.

Chris discussed the issues with diseased magnolia trees. Sue Hanley made a motion to remove the diseased magnolia trees. Maria Ford seconded.

Sue Hanley reminded Chris that it is time to cancel the trash.

Asset Management Committee: No new updates. Green areas are in good shape.

Old Business: Jennifer Kelley and Sue Hanley received some quotes for the Bob Gray memorial.

Jennifer Kelley moved to accept the Dodds Monuments quote and purchase the memorial from them. Maria Ford seconded.

Jake Bontatibus discussed the events for Halloween including the details of the parade and the movie night. The sponsor of the movie night is Beyond Belief Productions, and Jake asked if he could place an advertisement in the Murmurs in exchange for the sponsorship. Sue Hanley made a motion to offer two months of business card advertising in the Murmurs. Shelton Monger seconded.

Jake asked if he could have additional money for the Halloween budget to purchase decorations from a liquidation sale. Jennifer Kelley made a motion to add \$200 to the Halloween budget for the purchase of decorations. After no second, Jennifer rescinded the motion and further discussion ensued. Greg Herman made a motion to add \$300 to the Halloween budget for the purchase of decorations. Shelton Monger Seconded.


Vote 7-0

Dayton Police Launch "Safe Exchange" Program

The Dayton Police Department's East Patrol Operations Division announces the launch of the Safe Exchange program. Safe Exchange is designed to provide a safe location for families to make custodial exchanges and to assist residents with the exchange of products purchased or sold online. This service is part of the Dayton Police Department's commitment to community safety.

There are now designated areas at East Patrol Operations Division North (417 E. Helena St.) and East Patrol Operations Division South (2721 Wayne Ave.) where online buyers/sellers and parents or guardians can meet to make needed exchanges.

Once both parties have agreed on exchange terms, they may meet at one of the two locations and look for the "Safe Exchange

Zone" sign near the main entrance. The building lobby at the either location will be available during regular business hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday). If the lobby is not accessible, the parking lot is also a safe exchange zone because it is monitored and recorded by video surveillance. In addition, a peace officer may be requested to be present during the exchange by calling 333- COPS.

No firearms are permitted inside Dayton Police Department buildings, including the lobby area. The Safe Exchange Zones will not be utilized to make transactions of illegal products or any dangerous materials.

While the Safe Exchange program has been established to provide a safe area for online buyers and sellers to meet, it is important to remember that the people you meet online are strangers and may not have your best interests in mind.

Here is some additional information to consider when making or planning online purchases or transactions:

- Use websites you are familiar with.
- Never provide personal information over the Internet.
- Never make an online purchase using a credit card on a site that does not have an SSL.
- When taking photos, utilize the cut and paste method from a Word document. This will make it difficult to utilize GPS location programs.

Use photos only of the item(s) you are selling. Other items in the background can represent additional targets for a would-be criminal.

Ask a lot of questions.

Don't go to a transaction alone, and show up early.


