Call for Lifeguard Applications 2018 Season

The Forest Ridge Association is accepting applications for lifeguards and Recreation Supervisors for the 2018 season. Those interested must have current Lifeguard training, Standard First Aid, and CPR for the Professional Rescuer. Those with old Lifeguard Training will be required to update when the pool opens. WSI certification is recommended for consideration but not required for the available positions. Applications should be in résumé form and must include copies of the front and back of all certifications. The résumé should include any experience with young children, school, and community activities. Also include 2 written references from former employers, teachers, or community leaders. Previous employees of FRA do not need to submit references. The staff is responsible for helping with the opening of the pool and must be available to work on weekends during May (possible exceptions if away at school). You must also include your swimsuit and shirt size, date you can start full-time, all dates you must have off, and when you return to school.

Each year of experience means one season consisting of at least eight full weeks. For example, if an individual was hired prior to June 30 and works through Labor Day, the individual will be paid the next step the next year. If the individual is hired after July 1, the individual will be paid the same step for the entire next year. Prior experience at another pool, regardless of the number of years, will qualify the individual for a Step 2 if it can be verified that the individual has at least one full year of experience.

Residents of Forest Ridge receive preference for these positions, assuming they are otherwise qualified. WSI qualified applicants are preferred.

¹ Lifeguard certifications must be current at all times. It is the responsibility of each employee to provide such certification to the Recreation Area Manager. The base rate will be effective from the date the manager receives the certification, not retroactive to the date of the certification. If the Manager does not have a current lifeguard certification on file, the employee will be paid \$3.95/hour until such certification is provided.

² Current WSI certificates must be provided to the Recreation Area Manager in order to receive this rate. Once the WSI certification expires, the individual will be paid at the base rate until a current WSI certificate is again provided to the Recreation Area Manager. The WSI rate is effective on the date the Recreation Area Manager receives the current certificate, not retroactive to the effective date of the certificate.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest and Lindsay's Law Parent/Athlete Signature Form



What is Lindsay's Law? Lindsay's Law is about Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) in youth athletes. It covers all athletes 19 years or younger who practice for or compete in athletic activities. Activities may be organized by a school or youth sports organization.

Which youth athletic activities are included in Lindsay's law?

- Athletics at all schools in Ohio (public and non-public)
- Any athletic contest or competitions ponsored by or associated with a school
- All interscholastic athletics, including all practices, interschool practices and scrimmages
- Allyouthsportsorganizations
- All cheerleading and club sports, including noncompetitive cheerleading

What is SCA? SCA is when the heart stops beating suddenly and unexpectedly. This cuts off blood flow to the brain and other vital organs. People with SCA will die if not treated immediately. SCA can be caused by 1) a structural issue with the heart, OR 2) a heart electrical problem which controls the heartbeat, OR 3) a situation such as a person who is hit in the chest or a gets a heart infection.

What is a warning sign for SCA? If a family member died suddenly before age 50, or a family member has cardiomyopathy, long QT syndrome, Marfan syndrome or other rhythm problems of the heart.

What symptoms are a warning sign of SCA? A young athlete may have these things with exercise:

- Chest pain/discomfort
- Unexplained fainting/near fainting or dizziness
- · Unexplained tiredness, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Unusually fast or racing heart beats

What happens if an athlete experiences syncope or fainting before, during or after a practice, scrimmage, or competitive play? The coach MUST remove the youth athlete from activity immediately. The youth athlete MUST be seen and cleared by a health care provider before returning to activity. This written clearance must be shared with a school or sports official.

What happens if an athlete experiences any other warning signs of SCA? The youth athlete should be seen by a health care professional.

Who can evaluate and clear youth athletes? A physician (MD or DO), a certified nurse practitioner, a clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse midwife. For school athletes, a physician's assistant or licensed athletic trainer may also clear a student. That person may refer the youth to another health care provider for further evaluation.

What is needed for the youth athlete to return to the activity? There must be clearance from the health care provider in writing. This must be given to the coach and school or sports official before return to activity.

All youth athletes and their parents/guardians must view the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) video about Sudden Cardiac Arrest, https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=s-YfCWQPeqw, review the ODH SCA handout and then sign and return this form.

Forest Ridge Association Board of Trustees Regular Meeting November 20, 2017

Trustees Present: Chris Hoopes, Rick Schaub, Shelton Monger, Heather Gwin, Cory Hendrix, and Charles Mahan

Trustees Absent: Larry Ford and Youssef Elzein Chris Hoopes called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Minutes: Charles Mahan moved to accept the minutes as corrected from the previous month. Shelton Monger seconded.

Vote 6-0

Treasurer: Dan Freeman, Treasurer presented the Treasurers' report for October. The balance of the general fund is \$17,567.05. The balance of the replacement reserve is \$67,832.83. There were 3 full and no partial assessments received in October (681.00) and no full so far in November (\$0.00). There are 54 full and 2 partial assessments still open. Shelton Monger made a motion to accept the report and Charles Mahan seconded.

Vote 6-0

Police Report: Officer Toscani from the City of Riverside was present. He reported the details of the criminal activity in the previous month. He said there were several hit and runs. He also discussed several car break ins and reminded residents to lock their car doors and be sure to remove valuables.

Doug Benbow voiced concern about residents leaving their doors unlocked. He emphasized the seriousness of becoming a target.

Officer Toscani also discussed a community event the police department will be holding on December 9th from 2pm to 6pm to gather donations for local people in need.

Officer Miller from the City of Dayton was present to discuss the criminal activity in the previous month, and he said there was nothing to report. Cory Hendrix asked about the mobile speed cameras, and Officer Miller said they would be going back out soon.

By Laws Update: Charles Mahan discussed the update of the bylaws including the acquisition of information from the title company as required by statute. He is getting a quote to digitize all the paperwork. He said they are ready to go with the amendment(s), but there is still an open issue of tying down exactly what language is required according to the vote.

Charles Mahan made a motion to instruct the law firm to update/change Article VII and Article X as proposed in the handout during the vote. Shelton Monger seconded.

Rick Schaub voiced concern with the changes to Article X. Charles Mahan said that he views the changes differently and explained his view.

Doug Benbow discussed some history and voiced his opinion that the by-laws need to be updated and agreed with Charles Mahan's interpretation.

The board discussed the different viewpoints on what was approved, and had open discussion about what should be sent as the update.

Emma Hoopes voiced her concern with attempting to change what was voted on.

Visitors and Open Forum for Association Members: Jake Bontatibus wanted to recognize Shelton Monger and the residents and board members that put in the effort to do the by-law updates.

Communication: Chris Hoopes discussed the Murmurs. He said that Emma Hoopes has volunteered to do the Murmur billings.

Pool: Shelton Monger said that they have placed an order for an additional guard chair. He also said he is still waiting on a quote to repair the crack in the lap pool. He said he will be doing some work at the pool over the next few weeks including putting in the new starting blocks.

Emma Hoopes discussed the swim team and said that this year was successful. Next year she said they will need volunteers.

Greens Areas: Charles Mahan said that the green area committee would be reviewing some options

Mr. Mahan also addressed the apparent lack of support from the Green crew. Mr. Tooley said that there was a lack of communication necessary and voiced frustration.

Chris Hoopes suggested making suggestions for improvements to communication and possible contract revisions.

Mr. Benbow voiced his appreciation for the green area crew.

Chris Tooley, Green Area Manager, submitted the following report:

Projects this month:

- Installed new leaf bagger
- Fixed boom sparyer

- Cleanup storm damage
- Started a fall cleanup
- Started leaves

Chris Tooley suggested replacing some of the fluorescent lights with LED. The board concurred. He also discussed some necessary repairs.

Chris Hoopes recommended having a facility walk with the community to show all that is available and is being maintained to the residents. The board concurred having it in the Spring.

Activities/Recreation: Heather Gwin reported that the Halloween Parade was wonderful. She said it went well and they had representatives from the base, police departments, fire departments, and Stebbins marching band. She said the prizes and donations were good. She said she got a lot of good feedback. She got one complaint on the lack of flyer placement.

Doug Benbow thanked Heather Gwin and the supporters for the work they put into the successful parade.

Heather Gwin discussed the baked goods for first responders. She said they are waiting on some additional donations. Jake Bontatibus suggested that many people would be donating that don't notify online.

Heather Gwin said that many people have been asking about the basketball hoops. The board said they would install in the Spring and they would be looking for help from residents.

Jake Bontatibus asked whether there were plans for a neighborhood Christmas party. Heather Gwin said they would be doing a light fight again and she would start posting about it on Friday, but she was unsure about the party. Jake Bontatibus said that he would be willing to manage having a Christmas party.

OSHA Report: Rick Schaub discussed the update on OSHA. He said that most everything has been fixed that is necessary by December 10th. He said that there would be some pool updates necessary before opening in the Spring. He discussed the various necessary updates and training.

Doug Benbow asked about the lack of a bathroom at the shed. Rick Schaub said he is in discussions with the inspector on what is necessary. Jake Bontatibus discussed some background on the cost of putting in a bathroom. The board discussed potential concerns and more homework would be necessary.

Adjournment: Charles Mahan moved to adjourn the meeting. Heather Gwin seconded.



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
