The concentration recently has been on the pending Assessment vote. Once the results are finalized, they will be posted on social media and in the Murmurs. Also look for social media posts for upcoming activities.

**Greens Areas:** Mike Bradley/Bill Grant – not present.

Heather provided update. Only one, unqualified, candidate thus far. Looking to find outside consultants to fill in while we continue our search.

### Pool: Rich Spielman

We have renewed the contract for next year. We are in the process of draining the pool and closing it down for next year. Plumbing work and electrical work needs to be done in pool house and surrounding area, and there's a leak in L-shaped pool; research to fix this is ongoing.

Soon there will be a meeting to prioritize and budget next year's planned maintenance.

**Soccer:** Brittany Heckman – not in attendance. Heather provided update.

This year, we have 89 registered participants:

1 U6 team, 3 U9 teams, 1 very large U12 team

The Rosary team merged with us and is covering the cost of referees for extra games on practice nights, for additional play time per child.

WPAFB has 2 U6 teams, 1 U9, and 1 U12 that we will be playing against.

Ten soccer sign-up signs were stolen, nine from the Forest Ridge area, including one from Brittany's yard. At \$12 each, that is a loss of \$120. Brittany has possibly identified the culprit. All the missing signs were in Riverside.

#### **Activities/Recreation:** Heather Gwin

- The Halloween Hayride is October 21-23
- Fright Night is October 25<sup>th but</sup> we need volunteers
- Halloween Parade is October 26<sup>th</sup> Stebbins band is participating! 11am step off for the parade.
- Teal Pumpkin project notifies Trick or Treaters that the house provides non-candy items.
- Give Back event in November. Details will be shared in the future.

### Winter Activities:

- Luminarias process and volunteer needs are TBD at the moment. Possibly the Stebbins kids that need service hours could help, or our Boy Scouts. Actively recruiting for this.
- Christmas Light Fight

The plan is to allow online nominations and voting, and then formal judging to decide winners.

- Preliminary judging 12/16-12/18
- Online judging 12/20-12/22 TBD
- Christmas/Holiday party 12/14/19 at the sheds. This may depend on green area situation.

Treats for first responders 12/14-12/15 – dropping off at Sue Hanley's house. Sue has posted online about this and has plenty of volunteers at this time.

### **Special Guests**

City Manager: Mark Carpenter

Property Tax Levy – Ballot Issue #21 – November 5

This street levy (the same one that was on the ballot last year) will provide funding for the cost of road repairs and maintenance for our city. Pavement Management Group (PMG) did a pavement condition index (PCI) to rate our streets. We earned a 59 – although the goal of most community is in the 70s. 70% of Riverside's roads range from fair to failed on the rating scale. There is no current budget to improve our streets. This year we were only able to improve 6 streets, with a cost of \$350,000. This is a permanent levy, to cover the continuing expense. We will be targeting those streets that are in the worst condition first. If the levy passes, funds should be available starting in February 2020.

Forest Ridge and Meadowsweet are planned for next year, although not guaranteed. With the levy approved, they can work on a significantly larger number of roads (currently 5, with levy could be as many as 25-30).

In addition, there are 5 charter amendments on the upcoming ballot:

Issue 22: Article IV: Filling of Vacancies; Section 4.05

Issue 23: Article V: Procedure for Passage of Ordinances; Section 5.03

Issue 24: Article IV: Vacancies, Creation of; Section 4.04

Issue 25: Article XI: Nominations; Section 10.02

Issue 26: Article XIII: Council Interviews; Section 13.12

## Assessment & Reserve Funding Re-Vote!

Our September vote regarding the Assessment increase did not garner enough votes to constitute the required 60% quorum for a financial matter. We will be holding a re-vote, per the bylaws:

Under Article XII, Section 11, the Board of Trustees is going to call for a second "meeting" to vote on this issue. The bylaws set out these guidelines:

- The quorum at a second meeting will be half the required quorum of previous meeting
- The second meeting will be no more than 90 days after the annual meeting.
- At least 30 days written notice are given before the second meeting.


