

EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT



The earned income credit (EITC or EIC) is a refundable tax credit for low- to moderate-income working individuals and couples, particularly those with children. You may qualify (SEE GUIDELINES BELOW)!

TTT FITC up to \$6,557

If you lived with three or more children in 2019 and your family earned a max of \$50,162 (or a max of \$55,952 for married workers), then you can get up to \$6,557.

FITC up to \$3,526

If you lived with one child in 2019 and your family earned a max of \$41,094 (or a max of \$46,884 for married workers), then you can get up to \$3,526.

Need Tax Help? Free tax filing help is available for EITC-eligible households! **Turn the flyer over** for a list of agencies who can help file your taxes.

TTT EITC up to \$5,828

If you lived with two children in 2019 and your family earned a max of \$46,703 (or a max of \$52,493 for married workers), then you can get up to \$5,828.

EITC up to \$529

If you had no children living with you in 2019 and you earned a max of \$15,570 (or a max of \$21,370 for married workers), and you were between the ages 25 and 64, you can get up to \$529.



Get Free Help Filing Your Tax Return! Fast Refunds, No Fees!

IRS-trained volunteers are available to help EITC eligible workers fill out their tax forms for free. Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites are open from January 21st through April 15th.

You must bring the following items to the tax preparation sites:

- Photo ID
- W-2 Forms for wages earned in 2019
- Social Security (S.S.) cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for you and all persons in your family included on your tax return
- If you had Child Care expenses in 2019 bring the Provider's S.S. # or Employer ID Number (EIN) and address. Also, bring payment documentation for the total amount you paid to the Provider, and the amount you paid for each child.
- Any correspondence you received from the IRS in 2019 and 1098 & 1099 forms (if any)
- If you want your refund directly deposited into your savings and/ or checking account(s) bring your account number(s) with you to the tax site.
- If you are married filing jointly, both parties must be present in order to process the tax return.

For More Information: Call United Way of the Greater Dayton Area's HelpLink 913-2000 Some owners believe it is unfair when the board initiates collection remedies. What is really unfair, however, is when a non-paying owner forces the rest of the owners to pay more. When an owner is not paying his "fair share," it is you, the delinquent owner's neighbors, who suffer, in that you are being forced to pay a "greater share."

When association members do not pay there are a number of collection remedies available. The goal of these remedies is to encourage timely payment and to discourage late or nonpayment.

Association boards must demand that payments be current to pay association operation expenses, such as insurance and maintenance services. Because paying operating expenses timely is critical to the administration of an association, there are a number of remedies available to associations when its members do not pay. In Ohio, courts recognize the importance of smooth administration and will uphold and enforce the collection remedies available to association boards.

The first remedy available to associations is the imposition of an administrative late charge. Generally, governing documents define when payments are due and at what point payments are considered "late." Using these guidelines, the board can enact rules that spell out due dates, define whether or not there is a grace period and set the amount of the administrative late charge.

Collection letters are another avenue open to associations when attempting to collect on delinquent accounts. Collections letters are official, legal notices sent to delinquent owners and their content is governed by the Federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. As a result, collection letters are mailed by the association's attorney, not the manager or the board. The collection letter will inform the delinquent owner of the collection remedies available to the association and the costs that could be charged to the owner if the association is not timely paid in full. Some delinquent owners complain when they do not receive a "neighborly" reminder from the board. However, board members are good-will volunteers and should not be forced into the uncomfortable position of debt collector.

An additional remedy available to associations is placement of a lien on the delinquent owner's property to secure the debt. Many associations file liens on any balance that remains unpaid for thirty or sixty days. A lien is filed with the county recorder, becomes public record, and often affects the delinquent owner's credit rating.

Foreclosure is another remedy available to associations to recover delinquencies. A foreclosure is a type of lawsuit that seeks to terminate the ownership rights of members who do not pay. Foreclosure action will result in the sale of the home if the owner does not come forward and pay all delinquent fees, late charges, and the association's legal fees. The Ohio Supreme Court has specifically upheld governing document provisions that assess the association's legal fees against the delinquent owner. In other words, it is permissible for the association to charge the delinquent owner the costs of the collection letter, lien, and foreclosure legal fees.

Whenever you hear of a situation where your board is initiating collection remedies, realize that the delinquent owner, not the board, caused the action to be taken. More importantly, realize that the board is attempting to force the delinquent owner to pay his "fair share" so you do not have to pay a "greater share."

Sudden Cardiac Arrest and Lindsay's Law Parent/Athlete Signature Form



What is Lindsay's Law? Lindsay's Law is about Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) in youth athletes. It covers all athletes 19 years or younger who practice for or compete in athletic activities. Activities may be organized by a school or youth sports organization.

Which youth athletic activities are included in Lindsay's law?

- Athletics at all schools in Ohio (public and non-public)
- Any athletic contest or competition sponsored by or associated with a school
- All interscholastic athletics, including all practices, interschool practices and scrimmages
- All youth sports organizations
- All cheerleading and club sports, including noncompetitive cheerleading

What is SCA? SCA is when the heart stops beating suddenly and unexpectedly. This cuts off blood flow to the brain and other vital organs. People with SCA will die if not treated immediately. SCA can be caused by 1) a structural issue with the heart, OR 2) a heart electrical problem which controls the heartbeat, OR 3) a situation such as a person who is hit in the chest or a gets a heart infection.

What is a warning sign for SCA? If a family member died suddenly before age 50, or a family member has cardiomyopathy, long QT syndrome, Marfan syndrome or other rhythm problems of the heart.

What symptoms are a warning sign of SCA? A young athlete may have these things with exercise:

- Chest pain/discomfort
- Unexplained fainting/near fainting or dizziness
- Unexplained tiredness, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Unusually fast or racing heart beats

What happens if an athlete experiences syncope or fainting before, during or after a practice, scrimmage, or competitive play? The coach MUST remove the youth athlete from activity immediately. The youth athlete MUST be seen and cleared by a health care provider before returning to activity. This written clearance must be shared with a school or sports official.

What happens if an athlete experiences any other warning signs of SCA? The youth athlete should be seen by a health care professional.

Who can evaluate and clear youth athletes? A physician (MD or DO), a certified nurse practitioner, a clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse midwife. For school athletes, a physician's assistant or licensed athletic trainer may also clear a student. That person may refer the youth to another health care provider for further evaluation.

What is needed for the youth athlete to return to the activity? There must be clearance from the health care provider in writing. This must be given to the coach and school or sports official before return to activity.

All youth athletes and their parents/guardians must view the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) video about Sudden Cardiac Arrest, review the ODH SCA handout and then sign and return this form.

Document Fees, Explained

Fellow Residents,

Recently there was a discussion about the fees that Towne Properties is collecting during home closings for our outgoing residents. Below is an explanation of what those fees are for and what Towne Properties provides through their third party document production service Homewise.

HomeWiseDocs.com is a website used by Towne Properties to compile resale disclosures, lender questionnaires, governing documents, and other important information needed by realtors and attorneys to give accurate and updated information to the seller or buyer of a home. At the time of closing, Towne Properties ensures the documents in the Homewise repository are updated so when a title company needs them at closing, they are available. The fees Homewise charges are based on the level of documentation a Title Company or Mortgage Company, etc. may request for each particular closing and the timeliness of a request.

Sellers can and should provide their realtor, their buyer's realtor and the title company, copies of all their Association legal documents, a copy of their current budget, rules and regulations, etc. that they have in their possession. Then there is only a minimal need for documentation through Homewise.

If a seller does his/her due diligence, charges can be limited to a status letter which serves as a legal and binding document (protecting both the buyer and seller). The Status Letter is the document Towne Properties eventually signs off on from Homewise, confirming there are no outstanding debts at closing or confirming any actual debt. This accountability ensures that the Association is paid at closing for any outstanding debt.

We Can't Help You if We Can't Find You!

In an emergency, every second counts! Valuable time can be lost if your address number is not clearly posted where emergency responders can see it. A clearly marked address number is invaluable to paramedics, firefighters and police officers who may be looking for your address during an emergency.



In order to find you quickly during an emergency, the address letters on your home should be placed in a position that is legible and plainly visible from the street, and at least four inches high. The numbers should be Arabic numerals, and should be on a contrasting background.

You can purchase your own numerals, or if you require it, the Riverside Fire Department has a limited amount of address signs for purchase. These blue and white signs are \$15.00 each. These signs can be attached vertically or horizontally.

If you are interested in purchasing an address sign, please call 233-1801, extension 216 during business hours for more information.

Chickens and Ducks in Residential Areas

At the City Council's meeting on June 6, City Council voted to continue restricting chickens, poultry and other agricultural uses to being permitted only in residential properties in R-1 zoned areas having at least 1.5 acres. Properties under 10 acres in size require a conditional use permit for agricultural use approved by the Riverside Planning Commission.

Chickens and other fowl are not permitted in other residential zoning districts. Many Riverside residential neighborhoods are also prohibited from having poultry and barnyard animals due to deed covenants put in place when those neighborhoods were developed/built years ago. Although a title company may not continue to copy the deed restrictions into a deed as properties change hand, those restrictions carry forward until dissolved by the residents. If you have questions about deed restrictions for your property, you should contact the Montgomery County Recorder for further information.

Recreational Fires

The Ohio Revised Code and the Ohio EPA have set regulations regarding recreational fires. A recreational fire is used for the purpose of cooking food for human consumption, pleasure, warmth, or recreational purposes. Please, only use well-seasoned fire wood; the burning of yard debris and trash is strictly prohibited. The maximum pit or fire ring diameter is 3 feet by 3 feet, and the fire can be no greater than 2 feet in height. It is also important to keep in mind that the fire must be at least 25 feet from combustible materials and structures, with a fire extinguisher, working garden hose, or buckets of water provided at the site.


