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## **FRA Assessment News**

Fellow FRA Members,

I hope everyone had a happy and healthy Thanksgiving.

The Board has adopted the 2021 budget and has set next year's annual assessment at \$343.14 per lot. This breaks down to \$255.20 for Operational expenses and \$87.94 for Capital Reserve expenses. The assessment will be due on February 28, 2021 and Members should expect to see their assessment notices from Towne Properties no later than January 28, 2021. As a reminder, each Member has an account with Towne Properties that can be accessed through their on-line portal 24/7. This access allows you to check your account status and make your annual assessment payment when the time comes. Police Report: No police present due to Covid-19.

Minutes: September 2020 minutes approved as written, Mike Bradley moved to approve them, Scott Kreckman seconded.

Communications: Mike McHugh reported on the Communications Committee. Mike is currently addressing the FRA website. Jenn Bradley is actively monitoring Nextdoor and Facebook. Larry and Maria Ford are currently doing welcome packages. Roberta Havholm is currently handling the design and printing of the Murmurs.

The summer months were used to address the pool reservation system. Need to update.com vs.org need and clarify security (scans and encryption). Signup

Genius is renewing 28 Oct for a 12 month subscription for \$218. Discuss/clarify the process for submissions of articles or contributions and/or ads.

Maintenance & Greens: Scott Kreckman reported that he is working on the proposal for conversion of Greens work to contract with Brightview.

Infrastructure: Larry Ford reported that the culverts are being looked at by Craig Moore for possibility of repair. Willow Branch Tennis Court and Pool Basketball Court will be done April/May 2021 at a cost of \$6,500. Tennis court nets will be purchased thru Amazon at a cost of \$169.99 each (2 nets \$339.98). Looking at options for new playground equipment at the Pool. We were provided 3 different options by the vendor. One is \$33,000, one is \$35,800 and the other is \$48,100.

The three options provided were not exactly what the board was looking at. The board asked Larry to get with the vendor and look at some other options, willing to spend up to \$50,000 including tax. Want to get equipment that will appeal to both younger and older children.

Pool: Jesse Morgan reported the following on pool repairs.

- L-Shape Pool pressure test: Leak detection completed. Total - \$2,445.—
- ☐ L-Shape pool leak repair costs: \$12,305 plus estimated tax of \$850
- ☐ L-Shape pool repair details:
  - o 3 skimmers and tile repair hopefully will be completed this fall
  - o Large leak in deep end plaster wall will happen in spring 2021
- ☐ L-Shape and lap pool pump replacements Planned for spring 2021
  - o Neither meet PHDMC's flow requirements (Lap = \$1864.00, L-shape = \$9989.00)
  - o Requires rework of plumbing to go from two 2.5 HP pumps to one 7.5 HP pumps for L-Shape pool
- □ Lap Pool, Concrete Deck Replacement Tear out set to being possibly as early as this Tuesday but may not be until next week, plan is for entire replacement to be complete this fall.

- o Deck Replacement Costs: \$45,559.00, Heavy duty caulking: \$1438.00, New deck drains between pools: \$2838.00. Total - \$49.835 plus approximately \$3,500.00 for sales tax.
- Completed SwimSafe 3-Year contract renegotiation
  - o 5 lifeguards, one of whom is also manager. Previously manager was an additional person
  - o 2021 is at the same rate as 2020 \$83,533.00
  - o 2022 & 2023 rate is a 3% increase \$85,853.00



#### STATUS OF UNCOLLECTED FRA ASSESSMENTS

**Total Uncollected Assessments as of November 10, 2020**. Eighty- seven properties owe \$ 72,276. Thirty-seven properties owe \$ 57,483 for prior years and current year assessments and fees. Fifty properties owe \$ 14,793 for current year assessments and fees.

# Top 10 Holiday Safety Tips





1. Inspect electrical decorations for damage before use.

Cracked or damaged sockets, loose or bare wires, and loose connections may cause a serious shock or start a fire.



Overloaded electrical outlets and faulty wires are a common cause of holiday fires. Avoid overloading outlets and plug only one high-wattage appliance into each outlet at a time.

3. Never connect more than three strings of incandescent lights.

More than three strands may not only blow a fuse, but can also cause a fire.

4. Keep tree fresh by watering daily

Dry trees are a serious fire hazard.

5. Use battery-operated candles.

Candles start almost half of home decoration fires (NFPA).

6. Keep combustibles at least three feet from heat sources.

A heat source that was too close to the decoration was a factor in half of home fires that began with decorations. (NFPA).

7. Protect cords from damage.

To avoid shock or fire hazards, cords should never be pinched by furniture, forced into small spaces such as doors or windows, placed under rugs, located near heat sources, or attached by nails or staples.

8. Check decorations for certification label.

Decorations not bearing a label from an Independent testing laboratory such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Canadian Standards Association (CSA) or Intertek (ETL) have not been tested for safety and could be hazardous.

9. Stay in the kitchen when something is cooking.

Unattended cooking equipment is the leading cause of home cooking fires (NFPA).

10. Turn off, unplug, and extinguish all decorations when going to sleep or leaving the house.

Unattended candles are the cause of one in five home candle fires. Half of home fire deaths occur between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. (NFPA)









### Lap Pool Concrete Deck Replacement Project

As most of you recall, the Board instituted a "Reserve Fund" by establishing a Capital budget, in accordance with Ohio State law 5312, to cover capital expenses outlined in the 2017 Forest Ridge Association Reserve Study. This fall, we have started one of those projects with replacing all the concrete decking around the lap pool. This project was needed because we had detected significant erosion of the foundation underneath the decking, causing it to crack and sink in areas causing a safety hazard. Also as part of this project, we will be replacing the deck drains between the Lap, L-shaped and Kiddie pools to improve drainage in those areas. While we were hoping to have the work completed by the start of the cold weather, an issue with the steel gutter system has delayed the project and so we will have to finish after the winter weather leaves us in the spring. However, because most of the work will be complete before that, we still anticipate opening on schedule in May. This project is being managed by the Pool Committee and is anticipated to cost around \$60,000. Part of this cost is offset by money that was saved when we were unable to open the pool on time this year due to COVID-19.







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
