Scott Kreckman called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM **Minutes:** June 2021 minutes approved with small editorial changes presented by Jesse Morgan. Scott Kreckman moved to approve them, Frank Semmelmayer seconded

Police Report: None present

**Treasurer:** Report given by Scott Kreckman July 2021 Treasurer's Report. Exact financial numbers unavailable at Press Time-will be updated in next Murmurs.

**Communications:** Roberta Havholm gave report. A few new advertisers added to this month's Murmurs. Murmurs were slightly delayed due to an issue with the printer, but now delivered.

**Maintenance & Greens:** Scott Kreckman reported. Contract is in place, and Scott is giving our contractor a work list each week for 2 weeks out. Scott has had nothing but good reports thus far about his work. He will begin clearing trash from around the dumpster, but Board is attempting to find a new spot for dumpster to discourage public illegal dumping. Scott addressing the hornets' nest on Meadowsweet.

**Infrastructure:** Larry Ford reported. Culverts at Little Jeep Park need replaced, waiting on estimates. Replacement of culverts not due until 2023. Reviewed upcoming projects scheduled in the Miller Dodson Report.

Pool: Jesse Morgan reported. All work completed on all pools, and pools opened on time. Money handling improved, and a safe has been installed. Tablet purchased for sales management and tracking-this will allow for better processes next summer. Current issues we are facing are staffing, working with Swim Safe to address this. Some pool lights are inconsistently lighting, an individual scheduled to come look at this. Updates need to be made to next year Pool Policies. We will need to update language to be FHA compliant regarding age restrictions. Spring 2022, we will be addressing the pool pumps in the L-shaped pool in order to put a more efficient single pump. Neither pool meets PHDMC's flow requirements (L-shape current estimate is about \$9, 989). Lap pool will need to be repainted, \$24, 000. Completed pool repairs include: plumbing leaks repaired in showers, replaced bathroom handles that had failed (seeking quote to re-engineer plumbing in future in order to more easily repair issues in future). Water Fountain was donated, it has a factory leak and working with company for a warranty repair.

Also having an electrician give estimates on plugs for water fountain, office outlets, and a potential estimate for a new box.

**Recreation:** Soccer begins this week (Week of August 16<sup>th</sup>). Fields will be painted this week.

#### **Activities:**

Over the next month, there will be a day to clean out the secondary shed and begin to consolidate into one shed.

## A SIGN OF TROUBLE

With the fast approaching elections in November, the Board would like to remind everyone of the sign policy for FRA owned properties. This includes the center median along Forest Ridge Boulevard.

#### FOREST RIDGE ASSOCIATION RULE #19-001

**Temporary Signs** 

To halt the proliferation of temporary signs on Forest Ridge Association (FRA) property, the Board of Trustees hereby prohibits the placement of temporary or permanent signs of any type, except as outlined below:

- 1. Signs related to Forest Ridge Association official business or sponsored events.
- 2. Signs that the Board President or designee determines are of importance to or that serve the greater good of the Forest Ridge community as a whole. Sign owners must receive permission each time a sign is requested to be posted.
- 3. All temporary signs can be displayed for a maximum of thirty (30) days and must be removed no later than 48 hours after an event.
- 4. All ordinances regulating signage must be followed for the city in which the sign is placed.

5.

Examples of prohibited temporary signs include but are not limited to political signs, real estate signs, placards, and various advertisements and only apply to signs placed on property owned by the Forest Ridge Association. Homeowners may place signs at their discretion on their own private property.

The Greens Maintenance crews will remove and dispose of any signs located on FRA property, which includes the median along Forest Ridge Boulevard. Sign removal will occur during the crews' routine work assignments in the neighborhood. Removed signs will be held at the maintenance shed for five (5) days for owners to claim. All unclaimed signs will be disposed of after the 5 days. This policy shall remain in effect until rescinded.




