Steve Kreckman called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM

Police Report: No police present

Minutes: January 2022 minutes approved with changes presented by Roberta. Scott moved to approve, Jesse seconded.

Board Members and Committee Chairs: Discussed alternate positions in need of being filled. Faith Richardson will be the new alternate for the Pool Committee Chair. Tabitha Bentz will fill in for the Audit chair at this time.

Treasurer: Scott Kreckman reported.

Communications: Roberta reported. Requested all Murmur submissions as soon as possible to insure they will be included in next month's Murmurs.

Maintenance & Greens: Scott Kreckman reported. I-9s sent to contractors for past year. Maintenance contract sent for signature for this year's work. Scott is aware of several trees in need of addressing; waiting for warmer weather in order to combine tree work in order to save Association money. We will be compiling a list of needed tasks for Contractor to address at beginning of season. Large tractor has a hydraulic leak. Scott is reaching out to some individuals who might be able to fix the issue. Small shed will be cleared out in the spring, and a neighborhood call will go out.

Infrastructure: Larry Ford reported. Reviewed what Miller Dodson Reserve Report of 2017 estimated work would cost, and highlighted the many savings the Board was able to make. 2022 is a rebuilding year for our reserve fund as many improvements were made in 2021. The reserve study does not have anything scheduled until 2023, so we will focus on any repairs that present themselves throughout the year. Larry will be organizing the mulch delivery for Little Jeep Park as the weather warms.

Pool: Jesse Morgan reported. Pool is in a holding pattern until warmer weather. Not anticipating any repair work to begin until April when temperatures are stable enough to allow for proper curing.

Old Business: Still need to close out Huntington Bank account and transfer funds to Chase. Tabitha will be addressing this, this week.

New Business: Andrew LaRochelle presented on a Personal Finance Course. At this time, 7 out of 10 Americans live paycheck to paycheck, 44% of Americans can't cover a \$400 emergency in cash, and Inflation is currently over 7% and rising. Financial Peace University is a financial planning program completed by 10 million people that has been wildly successful. A Financial Peace University class will be held at Forest Ridge Baptist Church on Mondays at 7 pm for 9 weeks starting April 25. To sign up or to ask any questions please email ForestRidgeFPU@gmail.com. Larry was able to reach out to get estimates for new Reserve Fund Survey. Miller Dodson gave us an estimate of \$3737 but will not confirm when they can start or finish and not offering flexibility. Reserve Advisers, LLC \$3200 able to start late April and complete late May. They were also willing to work with us to create a clearer Reserve Survey that better highlights what areas they are addressing. The Board tabled the decision at this time to give the Board time to research both options and will discuss it and vote at our next meeting.

Member's meeting will need to be moved to April  $4^{\rm th}$  in order to insure proper notification can be given to all Members. Scott moved to approve movement of meeting, Frank seconded.



## Forest Ridge Swim Lessons 2022

In partnership with SwimSafe Pool Management Co.

	Class Description	Prerequisite	This class is for children who:
Feliz the Flounder	Level 1: Flounder Child will become acclimated to the water through games and will learn basic safety skills in addition to water submersion and floating with support.  Skills: Independent movement through the water, floating on front and back, recovery from a floating position, nose/mouth bubbles, introduction to bobs, and age appropriate safety skills.	3 years old on or before the first day of class	Have little experience in the water or are taking lessons for the first time
Jimmy the Jellyfish	Level 2: Jellyfish Child will expand on the skills learned in the Flounder class and learn to be in the water unassisted in both front and back positions while learning to propel themselves through the water using either arms or legs.  Skills: Floating, gliding, streamline body position, recovery, bobs, submersion, propulsive kicking, introduction to propulsive arms, sit dives, and safety skills.	Successful completion of all Flounder skills	Can comfortably submerge under the water and perform 5 unassisted consecutive bobs
Oliver the Octopus	Level 3: Octopus Child will learn fundamental freestyle and backstroke skills with emphasis placed on the coordination and timing of the strokes as well as the development of a strong flutter kick.  Skills: Novice freestyle, novice backstroke, elementary backstroke, side glide, treading, kneel dive, and safety skills.	Successful completion of all Jellyfish skills	Can independently perform a back float for at least 5 seconds
Private Lessons	Private Lessons There are no set times or days for private lessons, simply work directly with your instructor to schedule. Payment is made directly to the instructor. Cost varies based on experience. This is great for children who need individualized attention or for those who need instruction on higher level skills.	Best for ages 3 and older but can work with younger children in shorter increments.	Can independently focus for 30 minutes

## How to make the most out of lessons

- Arrive on time and ready for lessons
- Wear a well fitted swimsuit that is appropriate for lessons
- Children with long hair should use a hair tie or wear a swim cap
- -Swim goggles may be used by children in the upper level classes
- Children who are not potty trained must wear a swim diaper while in the pool
