Forest Ridge Association Board of Trustees Regular Meeting March 20, 2023

Trustees Present: Tabitha Bentz, Scott Kreckman, Roberta Havholm, Larry Ford, Faith Richardson, Jake Bontatibus, and Youssef Elzein (arrived at 7:03)

Trustees Absent: Frank Semmelmayer, Jesse Morgan Scott Kreckman called the meeting to order at 7: 00 PM Reminder that Annual assessments are due by the end of the month-late fees will be applied beginning April 1st.

Police Report: Officer Ambrose from Dayton Police was present. Not much to report from the last month, in Forest Ridge/Quail Hollow-only two incidents over the past month, one DV between siblings, and one smashed car window, but no severe issues.

Board member brought up issues with speeding in the areas and running stop signs, and a HOA member brought up issues with police officers also rolling through stop signs.

Officer Ambrose is also working on a report on Hyundai and Kia thefts, so if you have any questions those can be brought up at any future meetings.

Communications: Roberta reported. Murmurs went online last week, and there will be no physical copies this month. Anticipating a paper copy next month. Larry asked if we could add Welcome Packets to the website for ease of access.

Maintenance & Greens: Jake reported. Dylan should have a signed contract to the Board in 24-48hrs. Mowing will begin soon. The first few months are sometimes slow with mowing due to rain through the Spring. Some areas are weekly, but several are on a bi-weekly schedule to help with cost and scheduling.

Youssef found that Montgomery County provides seedlings to all residents; will provide more information if any residents wish to pursue. Faith inquired about the water meter rental for the Community Garden, and will provide more information at the next meeting.

Infrastructure: Larry Ford reported. A reminder that 2023 Reserve Study items are all just suggestions, so we will be able to prioritize. Larry still getting estimates for sign replacement, and will begin looking into replacing the swings at the Park so they can't be stolen as easily. Youssef mentioned that the City of Dayton was willing to come free of charge to look at our Culverts (a project for next year).

Pool: Scott Kreckman reported. We still need to address new pool passes. This year, all rolls and cards will be deleted and everyone will be re-entered into the system.



Lessons will only be cancelled if thunder or lightning is in the area 15 minutes before the start of class



Swim Lesson Levels

In partnership with SwimSafe Pool Management Co.

Class Description

Prerequisite

This class is for children who:



Level 1: Flounder

Child will become acclimated to the water through games and will learn basic safety skills in addition to water submersion and floating with support.

Skills: Independent movement through the water, floating on front and back, recovery from a floating position, nose/mouth bubbles, introduction to bobs, and age appropriate safety skills.

Jellyfish

Level 2: Jellyfish

Child will expand on the skills learned in the Flounder class and learn to be in the water unassisted in both front and back positions while learning to propel themselves through the water using either arms or legs.

Skills: Floating, gliding, streamline body position, recovery, bobs, submersion, propulsive kicking, introduction to propulsive arms, sit dives, and safety skills.

Successful completion of all Flounder skills Can comfortably submerge under the water and perform 5 unassisted consecutive bobs

Tips to make the most out of lessons!

- Arrive on time and ready for lessons
- Wear a well fitted swimsuit that is appropriate for lessons
- Children with long hair should use a hair tie or wear a swim cap
- Swim goggles (not a snorkel or mask) may be used by children in the upper level classes
- Children who are not potty trained must wear a swim diaper while in the pool

Forest Ridge Pool Rules

Health and Safety

- * WARNING: CORONA VIRUS may be present; use pools at your own risk
- * If you do not feel well or are sick, entry into the pool area is prohibited. Additionally, admission may be refused based on health concerns observed by the staff (illness, abrasions, bandages, etc.).
- * There is a water fountain with bottle fill station available. Bottled water can also be purchased at the concession window. Additionally, members may bring personal drinks in non-glass containers.

Pool Grounds Rules

- * FRA is not responsible for loss, theft or damage toproperty.
- * No loitering. Anyone causing a disturbance will beasked to leave.
- *Destruction of pool property will not be tolerated.
- * No glass containers.
- *No food in the pool.
- * No alcoholic beverages.
- *Please place trash in proper receptacles.
- * No pets.
- * No profanity.
- *Smoking in designated areas only.
- * Bikes must be parked in the bike rack area ONLY.Please lock up your bikes.
- *No running, pushing, wrestling or rough-housing.
- * No violence or threats of violence will result in immediate suspension.
- *Staff may stop any unsafe action taking place.

Pool rules are for the protection and benefit of all members and guests and have been adopted to secure safe operation of the pool. The Board of Trustees has empowered the Pool Committee, Pool Management Company or staff member in charge with the authority to suspend or expel anyone who does not comply with rules or instruction of onsite staff.

ALL RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED

Admittance

- * Everyone must have a pass or be an authorized guest.
- * All swimmers under the age of 10 must be accompanied by a guardian or the guardian's designee who is 13 or older. To appoint a designee, the guardian must accompany the swimmer on the first trip to the pool to provide written permission and an emergency contact number.
- * Children ages 10 12 may come to the pool unaccompanied with written guardian permission. The guardian must accompany the swimmer on the first trip to the pool to provide written permission

- and an emergency contact number.
- * Extended Hours and Breaks We have reduced lifeguards on duty during breaks and Extended Hours. Persons must be/be accompanied by a Responsible Swimmer to remain in the water.
- * Responsible Swimmer someone who is 15+, confident and competent in deep water, and mature enough to be responsible for their own or another's water life safety. Lifeguards have final authority to determine if a person is a Responsible Swimmer.

Guest Passes

- * 4 Single Day guest passes are free per lot/season.
 - * Single Day guest passes: Adult \$3, 6 & under \$1.
- * Weekly (\$12). Monthly (\$35). Seasonal guest passes (see manager) are also available to house guests or baby sitters ONLY, and are limited to 4 per lot.
- * 1 non-swimming adult guest in street clothes is free.
- * Pool manager may limit the number of guests admitted per member at any one time.

- * The Forest Ridge Fighting Fish is open to Forest Ridge residents and surrounding neighborhoods!

General Swimming Policies

- * Proper swim attire is required. Thongs and transparent clothing are not permitted. We reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of swimwear.
- * Obstructing ingress/egress points is not permitted.
- * During periods of peak activity, staff may limit the number of swimmers in the pool.
- * All swimmers may be required to pass a basic swimtest at the discretion of staff in order to determine if swimmer is safe in water over his or her head.
- * A rest period may be required if fatigue or chill is observed by the staff.
- * Breaks occur 15 minutes before the hour (excluding the last operating hour) and last for 15 minutes. Only those who are/are accompanied by a Responsible Swimmer may remain in the water.
- * Diving board may be closed at staff discretion. Front dives only. No horseplay or swimming in the diving well. Flotation devices are not permitted in the diving well.
- * Coast Guard (USCG) approved flotation devices may be allowed at staff discretion.
- * Wading Pool Zone: Restricted to children 44" or under. All children must have a Responsible Swimmer with them in the Zone at all times. Lifeguard duties do not extend to the wading pool.
- * Competition Pool: Two lanes will be reserved for lap swimming. During peak swim times, pool may be opened for general use. After 4pm, lap swimmers receive preference for use.

Discipline Procedures

- * 1st Offense: Warning
- * 2nd Offense: Sit out for staff specified period of time
- * 3rd Offense: 3-day suspension
- * 4th Offense: 7-day suspension and review by pool committee for possible seasonal expulsion

In cases of serious infractions, the pool staff may escalate the discipline procedures as needed. Upon swimmer suspension, once the penalty period has passed, a parent/guardian signature will be required for the suspended swimmer to return to the pool.

2023 Special Pool Dates

- * Pool Opens May 27th
- * Independence Day Party July 4th.
- * Pool Raft Party August 5th.
- * Last Day of Swim Season September 4th
- * Doggie Swim September 5th (6:00 to 8:00)

Private Parties

- * Scheduled by request to pool manager.
- * Start after 8:00 pm and must end by midnight.
- * 2-hour minimum duration.
- * \$ 110.00 deposit to reserve date, balance due by the start of the party.
- * Cancellation must be received 3 days in advance of the party for a full refund.
- * FRA initiated cancellations will result in full refund.
- * Fees will be on an hourly rate as follows:

```
< 25 people -- $ 110 per hour
26-50 people -- $ 150 per hour
51-100 people -- $ 190 per hour
```

- * Alcohol for personal consumption is permitted; no glass containers.
- * ALL other pool rules/policies apply during parties.
- * Manager may terminate a party without refund for failure to adhere to these rules.

The pool may have special operating hours at the beginning and/or end of the season due to lifeguard availability. These hours will be posted at the pool entrance in advance.

The pool may be closed for maintenance, weather or other emergencies as needed with or without advance warning. The pool may also be closed to general use for FRA sanctioned events, such as home swim meets. Swim meet dates will be posted in advance.
